Supervisor Fox moved approval of the above resolution, second by Supervisor Podzilni.

Ms. Wiegand and Mr. Wilson said they feel the additional funds are important to their outreach, helping the citizens of Beloit to remain in their homes, and feel this money would be well spent. They added that it also helps as a safety check and adds the human touch. They said

they have nine routes running Monday through Friday, and they run four routes on Saturday and Sunday. Each driver delivers 10 to 16 meals per day. In 2018 they served 26,871 meals and in 2019 they served 29,012, an 8.3% increase. On average they served 93 meals per day in 2018, and averaged 106 meals per day in 2019, a 14.1 increase in the average number of meals per day.

Ms. Wiegand said they receive \$37,000 in Federal funds per year and respectfully request an additional \$5,000 from the County to make the full \$10,000 they requested.

Supervisor Yeomans asked about the rest of the County. Mr. Smith said the Council on Aging delivers for the rest of the County. Ms. Wiegand said they deliver to anyone with a 53511 ZIP code. Mr. Smith added that Mercy also has a meal program.

Mr. Wilson said most of their seniors cannot pay the full amount of the meal. Ms. Wiegand added that the funds from the Council on Aging goes toward the cost of the meal.

Supervisor Yeomans said the County delivers 15,000 meals in the City of Janesville. Mr. Smith said, if the Beloit Meals on Wheels did not deliver the meals in Beloit, the County would take over delivery and it would be in the best interest of the County to have them continue.

Supervisor Beaver asked if they had administrative costs. Ms. Wiegand said they do, but these funds come from a different source.

Ms. Oja said the Council on Aging has used tax levy money for the past two years. Supervisor Yeomans said, from a fiscal standpoint, the County is in the same boat as Beloit Meals on Wheels and the money will run out eventually. Chair Mawhinney said the \$5,000 already in the 2020 budget for them came out of the balance fund. Mr. Smith agreed and said this was a one-time federal fund.

Mr. Wilson said the need is only going to be greater as the elderly population grows.

Chair Mawhinney asked Supervisor Schulz why this was not asked for when the budget was being adopted, why wait until now. Supervisor Schulz said it was a misunderstanding on her part that it was not the full \$10,000.

Discussion on the budget process and how the committee chairs come to the first meeting after the budget is presented to request to changes to the proposed budget.

Supervisor Yeomans said that giving the additional funds to them now would be to their detriment as the funds will run out faster and future amounts would then need to be cut. Supervisor Schulz said we need to ask our government to give more funds to take care of the elderly, and that we need to advocate more.

Discussion on the 24 corporations who are partnering with Beloit Meals on Wheels and how they are helping by supplying drivers during work hours.

PASSED on the following vote: YES – Supervisors Beaver, Fox, Mawhinney and Yeomans; NO – Supervisor Podzilni.

Approving Contract for OPEB Actuarial Valuation Services Ms. Oja handed out copies of the request (attached) and went over it. She said it is for two years and that it went up about 5%.

Supervisor Yeomans said he feels the cost should be added to the cost of the premiums. Ms. Oja said these are for the financial statements. Mr. Smith said the cost of the premiums have already been given to the employees and there is then a lock on the costs. Supervisor Yeomans said there is the ability to tack on a fee for employees who have left. Mr. Smith said this is something the County Board would need to take action on.

Supervisor Beaver moved approval of the two year contract for the OPEB valuation at a cost of \$10,500 for 2019 and \$5,250 for 2020, second by Chair Mawhinney. ADOPTED.

Supervisor Beaver said this needs to get done but also the fees should be looked at. Supervisor Yeomans requested this be brought back for discussion at the next meeting.

Approval of Contract for OPEB Actuarial Services

The Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) sets the financial reporting rules for government. Per GASB, governments must report their Other Post-Employment Benefits (OPEB) liability. OPEB liabilities are costs that the government entity has promised to pay on employees behalf in the future. Rock County's OPEB liability consists of:

- Health insurance provided to Deputy Sheriffs and Deputy Sheriff's Supervisor retirees and their dependents.
- Costs for other retirees who opt to pay 100% of their health insurance premiums until age 65.
- Costs for eligible employees participating in the Post Employment Health Plan (PEHP) to pay for healthcare premiums upon retirement.

In order to comply with OPEB rules, valuations must be done at least every 2 years. The actuarial valuations must determine the OPEB cost which is the annual required contribution (ARC) and the "net OPEB obligation" which is the difference between the employer's OPEB cost and actual annual employer contributions to the OPEB plan.

Gabriel, Roeder, Smith & Company (GRS) is a nationally recognized actuarial firm with the expertise to complete the valuation under ever changing GASB rules. GRS has offered to complete our OPEB valuations for \$10,500 for FY2019 and \$5,250 for FY2020.

Rock County has received Mental Health Block Grant funds for years from the State of Wisconsin. In 2019, counties were offered two payments of additional supplemental funds, the first to be used by 9/30/19 and the second by 9/30/20. This resolution allocates the second payment, \$70,004, to fund (1) a 1.0 FTE Crisis Worker in the Janesville Police Department and (2) projects to enhance client services available through Beloit Area Community Health Center.

Crisis Services and the Janesville Police Department completed a successful exploratory integration of a 0.4 FTE Crisis Worker into the JPD using existing resources, but a primary identified need is to embed a 1.0 FTE Crisis Worker more fully into the operations of JPD. Best practice in law enforcement and behavioral health is to deescalate and resolve behavioral health crises within a community-based model that maximizes client choice and respect and minimizes coercion and power struggles. The MHBG Supplemental Award will fund a 1.0 FTE Crisis Worker through September 30, 2020. Funds are being transferred from the Outpatient Contracted Services line to cover the remainder of the year.

There will be approximately \$22,000 in remaining grant funds. These funds will be used for projects to enhance client services available through Beloit Area Community Health Center.

-EXECUTIVE SUMMARY-

ACCEPTANCE OF WISCONSIN DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES COUNTY CONSERVATION AIDS GRANT FUNDS AND AMENDING PARKS BUDGET

Each Wisconsin County is allocated a certain amount of money annually to fund small projects on a 50/50 match basis. This year we will be using our allocated funds to help pay for a (kayak/canoe) boat launch at Murwin Park.

Rock County was originally allotted \$1,927 in County Conservation Aids grant funds. An additional \$1,301 in County Conservation Aids grant funds have become available, for a total award of \$3,228 for 2020. The recommended 2020 budget includes \$5,000 for this grant. This resolution accepts the \$3,228 in County Conservation Aids funds and reduces the 2020 budget from \$5,000 to \$3,228.

A boat launch at Murwin Park was recommended in the 2015-2020 Rock County, Wisconsin Parks, Outdoor Recreation and Open Space (POROS) Plan. Murwin Park is located approximately 11 miles northwest for the City of Janesville. This 40+ acre park encloses a substantial amount of shoreline of the Yahara River at the Village of Fulton. A boat launch would improve river access due to an increase in recreational activities. Murwin Park will provide an excellent place to launch to travel downstream to the confluence with Rock River or a takeout point for people paddling the Yahara River.

Though this funding source required a 50% match by the County, all time and materials supplied by the Parks and Highway Divisions, as well as other community resources, may be used as a match.

Request Approval for the Purchase of Panasonic Toughbooks

The Rock County Sheriff's Office utilizes Panasonic Toughbook laptop computers within their squad cars. Each year a number of these are purchased to replace those that are broken, worn, or no longer adequate to operate the software and systems used by the law enforcement staff.

The Panasonic Toughbooks are ruggedized laptops that are made to withstand extreme temperature, excess vibration, and abnormal abuse that are common in police work. This authorization is for six Toughbooks that will replace units that are five years old and cause regular difficulties for the deputies and Information Technology staff.

The Toughbooks are being purchased from Baycom, Inc. from Green Bay, WI off of state contract (505ent-o16-naspocomput-02), and includes a five-year warranty. The cost of the six Toughbooks is \$15,054.

Executive Summary

The cost to provide employees through Manpower for one week totals \$1,173.44. The cost to have those same individuals become part time County employees is \$1,054.43. This is a savings of \$119.01 per week. Over the course of 52 weeks the total savings would be \$6,188.52.

While employed by Manpower we reimburse Manpower \$15.44 per employee for four employees and \$16.17 for one employee who has been employed for over 10 years. Manpower reimburses four employees \$10.50 per hour and one employee \$11.00 per hour.

As County employees, they would all receive a raise of \$1.50 per hour. We feel that this would increase moral substantially and also give the employees more incentive, as they would no longer be considered a "temp" employee.

Historically, Manpower does not recruit site managers for Rock County. Whenever one is needed, our Nutrition Supervisor finds them and sends them to Manpower to complete their paperwork. There will be no hardship incurred to the County by releasing Manpower as an employment source.

In determining whether to approve the policy of having Sheriff's Office deputies provide security screening at the Courthouse, the County Board must weigh the benefits of the higher level of security versus the increased cost. The advanced training deputies receive provides greater confidence that security incidents will be handled appropriately and overall safety increased. With a total estimated annualized cost of up to \$162,000, the budget-to-budget increase of \$88,500 means that the Board would be deciding to allocate this amount from the levy limit increase it will be allowed for 2021, which using the 2020 levy limit figure would have represented about 6.8% of the new tax levy funding available.

Executive Summary

Recently, Rock County completed a \$6.8 million dollar security upgrade to the courthouse. The upgrade included modernized and expanded screening stations at the public entrance. These stations are currently staffed by private security personnel.

Brent Sutherland, the Rock County Facilities Management Director, performed an extensive study of best practices for courthouse security. The study revealed that armed officers at the entrance was a significant deterrent to preventing courthouse violence. Therefore, after input from the County Board, the Sheriff's Office is offering this proposal to hire part-time Court Deputies to replace private, unarmed security.

The hiring of the part-time Court Deputies would provide operational flexibility to efficiently address the day to day requirement of staffing, scheduling, and benefit time off for Deputies in the courthouse.

The amount required to facilitate the hiring of part-time Court Deputies in 2020 is \$149,043. This amount is pro-rated assuming a start date for these Court Deputies of no earlier than March 9, 2020. The actual date the Court Deputies would begin providing services would be contingent on the amount of time required to train these staff and provide notice to the current private security contractor (no less than 30 days' notice). This costs includes one-time purchases of equipment, including vests, radios, and firearms.

The resolution would authorize an additional 2.2 FTE Deputy positions, which are intended to be part time and spread among no more than 7 individuals who would be working less than 0.5 FTE each.

The estimated annual costs for the Sheriff's Office providing this service using these assumptions totals approximately \$162,000. This represents an increase of \$88,500 over the 2020 budgeted costs for the private contract. This is estimated to be the maximum amount needed, as there are scenarios under which the service could be provided for a lesser cost. This would be determined following implementation once there is some experience with operating the security station.
