Re: Request for TAD funding resolution to be addressed at the next Public Safety and Justice committee meeting

Dear chairperson and committee members,

WISDOM and its affiliates are part of the Gamaliel Network which has been actively promoting criminal justice reform at the local, state, and national level. Treatment Alternatives and Diversion programs stand as a vitally important component of reform initiatives which ultimately enhances public safety.

We are convinced that the importance of TAD funding for our communities must be before the state budget committees all the time, so when they make periodic adjustments to the budget, funding for TAD will be in the forefront of their minds. Additionally, the state is talking about building a new prison in Green Bay and needs an alternative vision of treatment in lieu of incarceration.

Consequently, we ask that Rock County pass a resolution requesting an increase of \$15 million per year in TAD Funding (attached is a copy of a model resolution being considered by Waukesha county). Other counties considering similar resolutions include: Dane, Outagamie, Marathon, Eau Claire, Chippewa, Dunn, and Milwaukee. Since Rock County has been one of the leaders in the state in offering TAD programs, we hope that you will consider passing this funding resolution.

Why \$15 million? An increase of that amount would put us near the funding recommendation made in 2012 study by the UW Lafollette Institute (https://www.lafollette.wisc.edu/images/publications/workingpapers/cba2012-004.pdf).

DRAFT RESOLUTION

IN SUPPORT OF INCREASING STATE FUNDING FOR AND EXPANDING ACCESS TO THE TREATMENT ALTERNATIVES AND DIVERSION (TAD) GRANT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, Wisconsin's state prisons are overcrowded, understaffed and, in some cases, very near the end of their physical viability, and

WHEREAS, new OWI laws, the heroin epidemic, and the continuing crisis of methamphetamine addiction are threatening to further increase the population of our prisons, and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin has many proven, evidence-based, cost-effective alternatives to incarceration. Drug Treatment Courts, Veteran's Courts, Family Courts, OWI Courts, the Safe Streets Treatment Options Program (SSTOP), and other interventions have all proven to be more effective than incarceration for reducing recidivism, and

WHERAS, legislatively-mandated evaluations of the programs funded by the Treatment Alternatives and Diversions (TAD) fund show that they save taxpayers almost \$2 for every \$1 the state has invested, and

WHEREAS, Waukesha County has a Criminal Justice Collaborating Council (CJCC) which administers an Alcohol Treatment Court, a Drug Treatment Court, a Day Report Center, and several other diversion programs which have been proven to save thousands of jails bed days and the associated expense while improving public health and safety by addressing root causes of addiction,

WHEREAS, Waukesha County and all local units of government in Wisconsin are statutorily restricted in their ability to raise revenue to fund local initiatives such as those described above.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE AND THE COUNTY BOARD SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF WAUKESHA COUNTY

do hereby urge the Governor and State Legislature to enhance public safety and reduce unnecessary Corrections related expenditures by:

- 1. Increasing funding for the Treatment Alternatives and Diversion (TAD) Grant Program by \$15 million annually.
- 2. Changing the TAD statute so that people who were once convicted of a violent crime can be eligible if the new crime is non-violent in nature.
- 3. Changing the statute so that people with a mental health issue (and not a co-occurring addiction issue) can be eligible.
- 4. Focusing the growth in TAD in three main areas:
 - a. Expansion of OWI Courts, SSTOP, and other programs that address drunk driving;
 - b. Expansion of Drug Treatment programs that can help deal with the growing heroin problem, as well as the lingering issues of methamphetamine, crack and other drugs;
 - c. Expansion of funding for treatment alternatives that are targeted to the communities that have the state's highest incarceration rates.

Furthermore, the County Executive and the County Board of Supervisors direct the Clerk to send a copy of this resolution to our State Legislators and to Governor Scott Walker.
