





Executive Summary

ACCEPTING DOJ EBDM PRETRIAL PILOT SITES PROJECT GRANT AND AMENDING THE 2019 BUDGET

Rock County has been working with the State of Wisconsin and the National Institute of Corrections as an Evidence-Based Decision Making (EBDM) Initiative local site since 2015. Through a deliberative, collaborative process, using data and research to help guide decision-making, the County decided to enhance various areas of its criminal justice system. Through this process the County decided to establish a pretrial and assessment service program for individuals going through the criminal justice system.

The decision to release or detain a defendant during the pretrial phase of a criminal case has both short- and long-term consequences for defendants, the justice system, and the general public. Pretrial seeks to achieve three underlying goals: (1) maximize the release of pretrial defendants (recognizing the presumption of innocence and the harmful effects of pretrial detention); (2) maximize public safety; and (3) maximize court appearance. According to the research, making pretrial release and detention decisions without actuarial assessment guidance can have harmful effects on both defendants and the general public. Releasing extremely high risk defendants without assessment or matched supervision can be a threat to public safety. At the same time, recent research has also demonstrated that detaining low and moderate risk defendants in jail for even short periods of time (i.e., 2–3 days) can increase their risk for misconduct both short- and long-term. Pretrial risk assessment results will be used to guide release decisions and level of supervision necessary to ensure offender does not recidivate and attends all court appearances during the pendency of the case. A monitoring system to ensure compliance with release conditions will also be established.

Rock County, along with six other EBDM Pretrial Sites and the State of Wisconsin Department of Justice have been working to develop and implement pretrial programs in the pilot sites. These programs are designed to maximize public safety and court appearance while maximizing pretrial release. The pilot programs will utilize data and research to develop a model that can be tested and evaluated to determine the effectiveness, to potentially lead to replication in other counties. To this end, the WI DOJ established a grant opportunity to assist these sites with the aforementioned goals. Monies received under this grant will fund a pretrial case manager, which is contracted through JusticePoint (as the result of a competitive RFQ process), tools for pretrial supervision (GPS monitoring, SCRAM monitoring, Remote Breath monitoring, and Drug testing), and for the County's Justice System Manager, who oversees the pretrial pilot program in Rock County, to attend the National Association of Pretrial Services Agencies annual conference.







AUTHORIZING ACCEPTANCE OF JAG CRISIS INTERVENTION TEAM (CIT) TRAINING (2015) GRANT AND AMENDING THE 2019 BUDGET

The Wisconsin Department of Justice (DOJ), using funding through the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program, solicited applications from local law enforcement agencies, to assist in training law enforcement personnel in CIT. CIT is a 40-hour training program for law enforcement officers that includes basic information about mental illnesses and how to recognize them; information about the local mental health system and local laws; learning first hand from consumers and family members about their experiences; verbal de-escalation training, and role plays. The benefits of CIT training include:

- Reduced injuries to public, consumers, and officers
- Reduction in repeat contacts with the mental health consumers
- Reduction of criminalization of those persons with mental illness that come in contact with the criminal justice system
- Enhanced working relationships with the mental health care providers in the community
- Increased involvement of the families and friends of the mental health consumers
- Reduction in civil commitments through diversion to safe and less restrictive settings
- Reduction in the costs of overall services through better utilization of said services and diversion to less costly services

After inviting all law enforcement agencies in the County to participate in CIT training, nine agencies decided to pursue a CIT grant in 2019. The Rock County Sheriff's Office, Janesville Police Department, Beloit Police Department, Town of Beloit Police Department, Milton Police Department, Evansville Police Department, Orfordville Police Department, Edgerton Police Department, and Clinton Police Department, applied for and received DOJ grant funding in 2019 for CIT training.

In June 2019, Rock County was notified that its grant application to provide CIT training was successful in the amount of \$20,000. In order to provide the training, Rock County will partner with the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) Rock County. NAMI Rock County has the experience and capacity to provide this training to Rock County law enforcement officers.

There is no match requirement for the grant and the funds must be used by September 30, 2019.

PROPOSAL SUMMARY

Currently, Rock County is in the midst of a multi-million dollar security upgrade to its courthouse. Once completed, there will be only one entrance/exit for the public to use. The entrance is the first line of defense for the entire courthouse. The public entry will have a security screening station staffed with two persons. There are two staffing options identified for armed personnel working/manning the security station, the Rock County Sheriff's Office (RCSO) and Global Security Services (GSS).

BUSINESS DESCRIPTION ROCK COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE

The Rock County Sheriff's Office has been an established law enforcement entity that has existed for 180 years. It has a venerable, rich tradition of serving the community of Rock County, Wisconsin. The Sheriff's Office employs 210 individuals, who work together to support and advance the mission of the Sheriff's Office. The Sheriff's Office serves the community through principled care of individuals housed in the jail, and proactive patrolling of the county. Additionally, the Sheriff is statutorily required (SS 59.27 (3)) to "attend upon the circuit court" and is generally responsible for the safeguarding of court proceedings along with providing for the security of the courthouse. There are many additional subsets of responsibility that branch out from these aforementioned duties as well.

BUSINESS DESCRIPTION GLOBAL SECURITY SERVICES

Global Security Services (GSS), is a private security company that has been in business for 10 years. The company offers physical security protection, investigative services, armored transportation, and electronic security. GSS has security contracts with both private businesses and government organizations. GSS has been awarded the security screening contract at the Rock County Courthouse. GSS is able to provide reputable, positive references upon request.

GLOBAL SERVICES SECURITY PROPOSAL REVIEW

The proposal set forth by GSS reflects two armed security officers for the year beginning in 2020. GSS has an extensive written policy that embodies the Use of Force Standard as set forth through the State of Wisconsin. GSS also requires a minimum education of two years post-secondary schooling or two years military experience. All of their employees must pass an extensive background check, a drug screening, and 100 hours of training.

ROCK COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE PROPOSAL REVIEW

The proposal set forth by the Rock County Sheriff's Office is for two armed deputies for the year beginning in 2020. The Sheriff's Office requires a bachelor's degree at time of appointment with the expectation that the recruit is required to complete 720 hours of academy training. Upon finishing the recruit academy, the new deputy must complete a four-month comprehensive training before they set out on their own. The State of Wisconsin also requires all sworn law enforcement to complete 24 hours of recertification training annually. Per agency policy, deputies are required to train quarterly with their service weapon, passing the qualification course as set by the state.

PROPOSAL COMPARISONS

Although both organizations have some similarities, there are two distinct contrasts. One is the simple comparison financially, GSS is \$83,721.99 less annually than the Sheriff's Office. The second is the measurement of services provided by each institute. While GSS does meet the requirements, utilizing the Sheriff's Office personnel would ensure a more cohesive security force as deputies assigned to the security station would use the same communications as deputies assigned to patrol the courthouse.

Deputies would also train for range and emergency response together. In addition to shared communication and training, the deputies would be interchangeable with courthouse patrolling deputies and could supplement others in another location if an emergency occurred away from the screening station. Lastly, the personnel assigned to this position interact with officials and the public very closely. As a result, it is important to consider the comfort level of those interacting with armed security personnel in that position when making this decision.

SHERIFF'S OFFICE STAFFING AND BUDGET SPECIFICS

With full staffing of the RCSO Court Services Bureau, there would not be any need for a part-time position or overtime needed to fill the vacancy. The two deputies shift assignment would be staggered. The eight hour assignments would be 7:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m. and 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. By utilizing the nine positions already assigned to the Court Services Bureau, there would be enough overlap of personnel to always have two deputies at the screening area. The only events occurring after regular courthouse hours are county board meetings which equates to two meetings a month. The two meetings a month amount to 55 hours of overtime annually to be covered by the security screening deputies.

In providing this information for Rock County elected officials and staff, the Sheriff's Office simply wishes to ensure that they have the best information possible as they make this decision. If there are any other questions related to this issue, please feel free to contact me,






Three Options Being Considered

SUBJECT: Requested information – Armed Security

During the discussion related to armed security, there was several questions and concerns raised by General Services Committee members which I did not have answers for. I have reached out to resources to find the answers and surveyed additional employees with additional questions.

1. What is the number of active shooter incidents compared to the number of shootings caused by officers who have been disarmed of their weapon? **During 2016 & 2017 the US Department of Justice FBI reported there were 50 active shooter incidents resulting in 943 casualties (221 people killed and 722 people wounded. It also reported during that time frame there were 3 officers disarmed, assaulted and injured with their own weapon.**
2. The survey response was only 82 staff and does not truly represent the majority based on the minimal responses. **An additional survey was sent out to all employees not just the Courthouse as all will at some time visit the courthouse for HR or Administration.**
3. The survey question was written in a fashion that was a single loaded question. **The survey was revised and additional questions were asked and sent to all county employees. Survey questions and results will be shared at the meeting**
4. What is the cost comparison from our contracted security provider and deputies? **Attached is a copy of the comparison.**
