Encouraging the Rock County Public Health Department to Share the Address of All Positive COVID-19 Tests with Local Government Agencies

"NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Rock County Board of Supervisors duly assembled this _____ day of _____, 2020 does hereby resolve that it is the wishes of the Board of Supervisors that the Rock County Public Health Officer release the addresses of all positive COVID-19 test results to government agencies in Rock County that makes such a request.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if the Public Health Officer continues to refuse to share this information with local government agencies, then the Rock County Board of Supervisors recommends that the County Administrator release the Public Health Officer from her duties."

Supervisor Bomkamp moved approval of the above resolution, second by Chair Beaver.

Supervisor Bomkamp shared his feelings on why the sharing of information is important to first responders.

Supervisor Knudson asked for Corporation Counsel's opinion. Mr. Greenlee said, if this resolution would be adopted, it would only be in an advisory capacity.

Discussion on why distancing is needed; don't always know who has it and who does not have it; responsibility of the Public Health Officer; Public Health Nurses investigating and tracking communicable diseases; information HIPPA allows to be shared; 911 dispatchers share information if someone is dispatched to the scene where cases are present; the need to have the trust of people with COVID-19 in order to obtain information for tracking purposes; up to 50% of people with COVID-19 do not have symptoms; need to use universal precautions, wear your PPE, and practice social distancing; first responders, law enforcement, fire fighters, etc. should treat each situation they walk into as if COVID-19 is present; and everyone needs to work together, to stay strong, and we will get through this.

FAILED on the following vote: YES – Supervisor Bomkamp; NO – Supervisors Beaver and Knudson; and 2 vacancies.

Executive Summary

The Sheriff's Office was awarded \$58,008 in supplemental funds from the BJA FY20 Coronavirus Emergency Supplemental Funding Program. The BJA FY20 Coronavirus Emergency Supplemental Funding Program is administered by the Office of Justice Programs (OJP), U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ).

The purpose of the BJA FY20 Coronavirus Emergency Supplemental Funding Program is to financially assist with the unexpected and unforeseen expenses related to the Coronavirus Pandemic.

The program funds will be used for the Sheriff's Office's overtime expenses, PPE(Personal Protective Equipment) supplies, including masks, suits, face shields, hand sanitizer, and additional supplies and services associated with sanitizing the jail, squad cars, agency equipment, as well as personal equipment.
