Executive Summary Authorizing Acceptance of the Natural Resource Foundation Besadny Conservation Grant and Amending the 2011 Budget

Rock County Parks was selected as one of 28 Besadny Conservation Grant recipients. We were awarded the maximum, \$1,000 to design, fabricate and install State Natural Area educational signs. The Besadny Conservation Grant is a 50/50 match. Matching funds will come from staff time to design and install the panels.

Sections of Magnolia Bluff and Carver-Roehl County Parks were designated as State Natural Areas (SNA) in November 2010. The parks were selected based on their habitat quality and diversity, extent of past disturbance, context within the greater landscape, and rarity of features on local and global scales.

These signs will educate all users about the rare resources found in each park. Panel topic ideas include: SNA program and why each park was chosen; invasive species removal; prairie restoration; or threatened species management. Interpretive panels will be printed in full color on a high-pressure laminate surface — which will last for many years, even in an outdoor setting.

Interpretive panels truly are a wonderful educational tool, but they are expensive to fabricate. With limited budgets, outside funding was sought to cover the cost of these panels. The panel fabrication is made possible through this grant.

Executive Summary Authorizing Partnership Agreement, with the Pelishek Nature Trail Foundation, Incorporated

Rock County made this acquisition in September 1995, from Pelishek Contracting, Incorporated, for park trail purposes. Pelishek Contracting, Incorporated, had acted in advance to secure these lands from the Railroad Holding Company so that Rock County would be able to secure grant funding for the purchase of these approximately 63.85 acres of land running from Clinton to Allens Grove. Via the grant process, 100% cost funding for this acquisition was secured: 50% from the Snowmobile Grant Program and 50% from the Stewardship Program. The trail is open, developed and maintained for snowmobiles in the winter via operational funding in a yearly grant.

The Pelishek Nature Trail Foundation (PNTF) was formed to work with Rock County to develop, operate and maintain the trail during the summer months for bicycling, horseback riding, hiking and nature study. This partnership agreement provides a means for summertime trail maintenance and use. At the present time, a ten-year agreement is in place. This agreement is an extension of the existing agreement, with no changes.

The Pelishek Nature Trail Foundation does a wonderful job maintaining the trail and rest stops. We are incredibly thankful for all of their hard work.

The Pelishek Nature Trail Foundation is incorporated in the State of Wisconsin and has federal 501(3)(c) tax-exempt status.

ROCK COUNTY PARK AND CONSERVATION DIVISION REQUIREMENTS AND RESTRICTIONS FOR FERMENTED MALT BEVERAGE PERMIT

- I. These permits shall only be issued to civic groups for specific events.
- II. Only licensed bartenders shall be used.
- III. All Wisconsin Statutes in relation to the dispensing and consumption of fermented malt beverages shall be strictly enforced.
- IV. A. A uniformed law enforcement officer will be at the specified sales area to conduct any checking of identification to determine age as may be necessary, and will be continually present during operation of the beer sales area.
 - B. Permittee shall provide for checking and enforcement personnel to insure all these requirements are met.
- V. The Permit shall be valid for a single specified event and can be revoked with no notice if rules and requirements are not met.
- VI. No "carry-in alcoholic beverages" are permitted, only fermented malt beverages sold on site may be possessed or consumed on site.
- VII. Permittee shall furnish a "Certificate of Insurance" naming Rock County as an additional insured. This certificate must be in Rock County's possession prior to the grounds being set up for the event.

An excerpt from Chapter 11 of the Rock County Ordinances, 11.01(18) Intoxicants Prohibited:

"No person shall consume or possess any fermented malt beverage or intoxicating liquor, as defined by 1987 Wisconsin Statutes, sec. 125.02, on any property owned by Rock County, except that portion of the county airport designated by the Public Works Committee. Such possession and consumption of fermented malt beverages on the airport premises shall be subject to all applicable State Statutes and local ordinances including licensing of the restaurant operation by the appropriate municipal authority. The consumption of fermented malt beverages and wine, in all parks, except the 4-H County Fair Grounds, is allowed under a temporary permit issued by the Public Works Committee. The consumption of fermented malt beverages and wine on the 4-H County Fair Grounds is allowed under a temporary permit issued by the Agriculture and Extension Education Committee. Such temporary permits shall be subject to local licensing requirements and such other restrictions as the respective Committees may deems to be in the public interest. The Public Works and Agriculture and Extension Education committees may establish fees for the issuance of the permits referred to in sub (a) above to help defray the costs of park clean up.
