Approve Resolution Acceptance of Acquisition and Development Funds from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources for Turtle Creek Parkway and 2013 Budget Amendment. The overall project includes building renovations including an accessible facility and restroom accommodations which have been completed. Future project plans to be completed by June 2015 include a canoe launch, pathway, and landscape improvements.

He continues working on the Janesville-Beloit trail and is working with the County Surveyor on legal descriptions.
