# "Healthful Hints" Monthly Health News Column

#### What Does Public Health Do For You?

If you ask a group of people on the street what "public health" is and what it does, you're likely to get a variety of opinions. Generally speaking, public health is concerned with protecting the health of entire populations. This means public health is as much concerned about your individual health as it is about the physical health of the community around you.

Public health has touched your life in ways you may or may not know. Consider that a baby born in 1900 could expect to live only 47.3 years. In February, the CDC reported life expectancy has reached 77.9 years! Public health is credited with increasing the average lifespan by 25 years since 1900.

Do you know of other areas where public health has made us healthier and safer? As we celebrate National Public Health Week from April 4<sup>th</sup> to April 10<sup>th</sup>, let's take a look at CDC's Top Ten Greatest U.S. Public Health Achievements of the 20<sup>th</sup> Century.

- 1. Vaccination In the past 100 years, we have seen the eradication of small pox, elimination of polio in the Americas, and control of measles, rubella, tetanus, diphtheria, and Haemophilus influenzae type b in the United States and other parts of the world. Due to the efforts of public health, many of us will never experience the devastating effects of these diseases in our own lives or in the lives of those we love.
- 2. Motor-vehicle Safety —The reduction in motor-vehicle-related deaths is due to public health engineering efforts making both highways and vehicles safer, as well as successful efforts to change personal behavior (e.g. increased use of safety belts, child safety seats, and motorcycle helmets).
- 3. Safer Workplaces —Since 1980, fatal occupational injuries have decreased 40% due to safer workplaces.
- **4.** Control of Infectious Diseases –Infections such as typhoid and cholera, major causes of illness and death early in the 20<sup>th</sup> century, have been reduced dramatically through clean water and better sanitation.
- 5. Decline in Deaths from Coronary Heart Disease and Stroke Since 1972, death rates for coronary heart disease has decreased 51%. Changing unhealthy behavior, such as tobacco cessation and blood pressure control, together with improved access to early detection and better treatment have reduced coronary heart disease.
- 6. Safer and Healthier Foods Identifying essential micronutrients and creating food-fortification programs have almost eliminated major nutritional deficiency diseases such as rickets, goiter, and pellagra in the United States.

- 7. Healthier Mothers and Babies Since 1900, infant mortality has decreased 90%, and maternal mortality has decreased 99%! Mothers and babies are healthier due to better hygiene and nutrition, availability of antibiotics, greater access to health care, and technologic advances in medicine.
- 8. Family Planning Family planning has provided health benefits such as smaller family size and longer intervals between the birth of children; increased opportunities for preconception counseling and screening; fewer infant, child, and maternal deaths; and the use of contraceptives to prevent pregnancy and transmission of human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) and other STDs.
- 9. Fluoridation of Drinking Water Begun in 1945, this program now reaches an estimated 144 million persons in the United States. Fluoridation safely and inexpensively has resulted in a 40%-70% reduction of tooth decay in children and a 40%-60% reduction of tooth loss in adults.
- 10. Recognition of Tobacco Use as a Health Hazard Since the initial Surgeon General's report in 1964 on the health risks of smoking, the amount of adults who smoke has decreased, and millions of smoking-related deaths have been prevented.

The practice of public health is essential to ensuring a healthy birth, to making certain that a child or adolescent is experiencing healthy physical, mental, and social development and to helping adults at every stage maintain a healthy lifestyle which will ultimately lead to a richer, longer life. Together, we can make the health issues we face today a thing of the past.

## Accepting Contribution from Kiwanis Club of Beloit and Amending the 2011 Rock County Health Department Budget

#### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

As part of the Rock County Health Department's work with families with young children, the department sends public health nurses and environmental health specialists out to visit homes in the community and assess the risk for child safety/injury as part of our Healthy Homes program.

The Kiwanis Noon Club of Beloit was accepting grant requests for community projects dealing with the youth of the community. The Rock County Health Department applied for and was awarded a \$500 grant.

These funds will be used to purchase safety supplies such as door/cabinet locks, safety gates, smoke alarms, etc. to assist families in complying with the recommendations made by health department staff during Healthy Homes visits.

In 2010, the Rock County Health Department was able to complete over 70 home visits in our Healthy Homes program.
