Don't Let Your Next Step Be Your Last Fall

One out of three adults age 65 and older falls each year, but less than half talk to their healthcare provider about it, reports the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Among these individuals, falls are the leading cause of injury death. Falls are also the most common cause of nonfatal injuries and hospital admissions for trauma.

Your chances for falling increase with age. The rate of fall injuries for adults 85 and older is almost four times that for adults 65 to 74. The following four steps, courtesy of the CDC, can help older adults can remain independent and reduce their chances for falling.

- 1. Exercise regularly. Exercise is one of the most important ways to lower your chances of falling. It makes you stronger and helps you feel better. Exercises that improve balance and coordination (like Tai Chi) are the most helpful. Lack of exercise leads to weakness and increases your chances of falling. Ask your doctor or health care provider about the right types of exercise for you.
- 2. Have your health care provider review your medicines. Have your doctor or pharmacist review all the medicines you take, even over-the-counter medicines. As you get older, the way medicines work in your body can change. Some medicines, or combinations of medicines, can make you sleepy or dizzy and cause you to fall.
- 3. Have your vision checked. Have your eyes checked by an eye doctor at least once each year. You may be wearing the wrong glasses or have a condition like glaucoma or cataracts that limits your vision. Poor vision can increase your chances of falling.
- 4. **Make your home safer**. About half of falls happen at home. To make your home safer:
 - a. Remove things you can trip over (like papers, books, clothes and shoes) from stairs and places where you walk.
 - b. Remove small throw rugs or use double-sided tape to keep the rugs from slipping.
 - c. Keep items you use often in cabinets you can reach easily without using a step stool.
 - d. Have grab bars put in next to your toilet and in the tub or shower.
 - e. Use non-slip mats in the bathtub and on shower floors.
 - f. Improve the lighting in your home. As you get older, you need brighter lights to see wall. Hang light-weight curtains or shades to reduce glare.
 - g. Have handrails and lights put in on all staircases.

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h. Wear shoes both inside and outside the house. Avoid going barefoot or wearing slippers.

To lower your risk of a hip fracture if you do fall, make sure you are getting adequate calcium and vitamin D – from food and/or from supplements. Also, do weight bearing exercise and get screened and treated for osteoporosis. Don't let your next step be your last fall. By taking these easy and inexpensive precautions, you can help to prevent injuries from falling.

Accepting Rock County Coalition for Sexually Transmitted Infections Prevention Grant and Amending the 2012 Rock County Health Department Budget

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Rock County has experienced a significant increase in the number of confirmed sexually transmitted infections (STI) in recent years. From 2009 to 2010, the reported number of STIs (e.g. chlamydia and gonorrhea) rose by 18%, with a 32% increase in chlamydia alone. These numbers continued to rise in 2011.

STIs are associated with a significantly increased risk of cervical cancer, infertility, and premature death. Risky sexual behavior influences infant mortality rates.

Rock County Health Department applied for and was awarded a grant from the Wisconsin Partnership Program in the amount of \$45,664.00. These funds will be used to engage in a coalition-building project over 18 months to address the rising number of newly diagnosed STIs among Rock County residents, which is an opportunity that may not otherwise be economically feasible. Rock County Health Department has identified over 25 local non-profit organizations, community partners, media representatives, school systems, and businesses that will be invited to join this coalition. The success of the coalition will be measured by the following:

- 1. Assessment of services that currently exist for the identification and treatment of STIs. Any gaps in service will be identified and discussed.
- 2. Creation of an effective, sustainable multi-sector coalition.
- 3. Identification of evidence-based and innovative solutions to address gaps in service and opportunities for prevention.
- 4. Creation of an implementation plan.

The time period for this grant is 18 months, and a part-time individual will need to be hired to oversee this project. Once an implementation plan is created and a sustainable coalition established, Rock County Health Department will apply for an implementation grant to initiate the plan.
