WHEREAS, the County of Rock operates and maintains nearby Royce Dallman Park on Lake Koshkonong and the maintenance of Lot 31 has been deferred to the Town of Milton; and

WHEREAS, the County of Rock and the Town of Milton agree the current and future use of Lot 31 is for park and open space land for the local residents of Charley Bluff and the general public that this property shall be restricted to these uses in perpetuity.

Executive Summary

TRANSFER OF LOT 31 OF NELSON'S FIRST SUBDIVISION TO THE TOWN OF MILTON, ROCK COUNTY FOR PARK AND OPEN SPACE LAND USES.

The Country received Lot 31 of Nelson's First Subdivision in 1968 for non-payment of taxes. Subsequently, it has been maintained as park and open space since that time. That lot, along with adjacent lots owned by the Town of Milton (approximately .76 acres), provide recreation opportunities for the local residents of the rural development area called "Charley Bluff" and the general public. The Town of Milton has requested the County convey the lot for ease of maintenance and future development of recreation elements in the park.

The Rock County Parks Department runs nearby Royce Dallman Park which serves as an access to Lake Koskonong along with providing picnic areas and a pavilion. The Town of Milton facility provides some of these same amenities along with play structures for children. Conveyance of Lot 31 will streamline park maintenance and eliminate duplicative efforts.

Finally, in order to preserve the current and intended use of the property a note in the Quit Claim Deed from Rock County to the Town of Milton will restrict the use to public park and open space land uses in perpetuity.
