<u>Adoption of Agenda</u>. Supervisor Homan and Mr. Johnson moved the Agenda. There were no changes. MOTION CARRIED.

<u>Approval of Minutes of February 15, 2021</u>. Mr. Quint and Mr. Johnson moved the minutes. Mr. Cope asked a question regarding Bessie's Diner fee structure and received an answer from Mr. Cullen. MOTION CARRIED.

<u>Citizen Participation, Communications, Announcements, and Information</u>. Mr. Chuck Valle of SC Aviation introduced himself to the Board. Mr. Valle informed the Board that he has spoken with Earl Arrowood, the tower manager, regarding the lack of a Radar Repeater in the Air Traffic Control Tower. Mr. Valle told the Board that this airport is getting busier, there is 2nd class airspace just to the south of us, and this airport is very attractive to student pilots. In addition SC Aviation will be getting a new jet this summer. He feels it would be very beneficial to have a radar repeater in the tower but has been told this is a difficult sell to the FAA. With the tower receiving some Corona Virus Stimulus dollars he would like the Board to promote the effort to obtain this equipment for the tower. Supervisor Fox requested that this be on a future agenda for discussion.

Mr. Cullen introduced the new Airport Board member Ms. Christine Rebout. Ms. Rebout is the Director of the Janesville Convention and Visitor's Bureau. Supervisor Fox welcomed Ms. Rebout to the Board and said he felt she would be a great addition.

Review of Payments. The review for February 2021 and December 2020 was completed.

Updates, Discussion and Possible Action

Resolution: Approving the Purchase of parts for Repair to Airport Equipment and Amending the Southern Wisconsin Regional Airport Board Budget. Mr. Cullen explained that in early February, staff was using the big snow blower to move snow into a large pile and the machine became inoperable. The cost to repair this piece of equipment is very expensive. Wausau Equipment is the manufacture of this equipment and the only place to get parts so there is no need for this to go out for bid. The parts alone are around \$32,000 and airport staff believe than can do the repair which will take some time. Mr. Quint and Mr. Johnson motioned to approve the Resolution: Approving the Purchase of parts for Repair to Airport Equipment and Amending the Southern Wisconsin Regional Airport Board Budget. MOTION CARRIED.

<u>Airport Director's Updates</u>. Mr. Cullen gave updates on a variety of things that have taken place recently. A copy of the report is attached to these minutes. Items included:

- Reimbursement from the state for the airport's ARFF vehicle retrofit.
- Status of \$157,000 in CARES grant money
- Second round of COVID federal grant money in the amount of \$57,000
- Runway 18-36 micro-surface project that is currently out for bid.
- Runway 4-22 rehabilitation project originally slated for 2022 may get started this year.
- Snow removal cost so far for the 2020/2021 snow season. No de-icing fluid used and plenty
 of sand on hand as it was purchased last year.
- Wisconsin Aviation Conference location and dates.

Supervisor Fox asked if there was a shelf life on de-icing fluid. Mr. Smith from airport maintenance said there is no shelf life on de-icing fluid and we have about 5,000 gallons on hand. Mr. Cope asked where the unexpected funding goes to when it is received. Mr. Cullen replied that it will end up in the airport's general fund and is hoping that in a round-about way we will be able to use it to fund the Runway 4-22 rehabilitation project.

Mrs. Reese asked about Mrs. Hevel's potential retirement and Mrs. Hevel replied that it was probably not going to take place as originally planned.

Mr. Cullen stated that he did have one person provide feedback on the in-person meeting for today. They would like to have at least a call in feature for future meetings.

Airport Director's Updates March 15, 2021

- ➤ We have received full reimbursement (\$25,696) of the EcoEFP Retrofit Kit installed on our ARFF truck in October from the state. Due to the state's accounting methods, we will soon be invoiced for our 20% portion and need to pay back \$5,139.20.
- After being requested to provide more financial documentation, the state approved our request March 1st to receive our \$157,000 CARES grant money. We are hoping to see that money yet this month.
- A second round of Federal COVID grant money was approved in late December called the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriation Act "CRRSAA". We should receive another \$57,000. Also included in this CRRSAA Grant Program are amounts for FAA Contract Towers such as ours, in the amount of \$34,162. Funds for the Contract Tower program may be used to cover lawful expenses to support their operations. The state provided guidance on March 12th on the process to request these funds.
- Runway 18-36 micro-surface project is out for bid until March 18. It will take a couple weeks after that for the contract to be awarded. No timeline known therefore on when this project will start. Provided our budgeted funds allow, we will re-surface portions of taxiway Echo at the same time. I will communicate closures just as soon as they are known.
- Runway 4-22 rehabilitation project slated for 2022 may start this year. After consultation with Federal, State, and engineering officials, it's been decided the best course of action at this time is to complete a 4" mill and asphalt overlay. The initial engineering estimate cost is \$3.4 million dollars. The airport is responsible for 5%. The project bid date is targeted to start June 10. Work could start in August and last approximately 8 weeks. Runway 14-32 will remain open. Runway 18-36 will need to be closed approximately 7 days.
- Although the snow season likely isn't completely over, I'm optimistic that the cold temps and long lasting snow is behind us. We had 27 snow events from Dec 12 present day. We've spent approximately \$13,600 in over-time labor. Another \$64,000 was spent on equipment used in the snow removal process, i.e., tires, batteries, blades, broom wafers, cylinder repairs, salter engine rebuild. One-third of that amount was the End Loader snow-blower. That amount also included \$8,000 for sand last fall. We used some sand this season but will have ample supply for the 2021-22 season. We didn't use any E-36 fluid this year.
- ➤ The Wisconsin Aviation Conference is moved from May 2-4 to Oct 17-19 this year. It will be held at The Osthoff Resort in Elkhart Lake. Registration details will be forthcoming.
