Sue Prostko, NHA explained that the new facility has a lot more entrances then the old facility. That we are out in the county with corn fields around most of the building. Security was a high priority to keep the residents and staff safe.

NEW BUSINESS

<u>Family Council</u> – There will be letters sent out to resident's families to invite them to a Family Council Meeting. The group is being started so that families can voice any concerns, problems or ideas to the group.

Jim Haseman commends Sue Prostko, NHA for the great idea of starting the family council meetings. He believes it will make for a better facility.

Supervisor Howland made the suggestion to also contact some family members by phone for a more personal touch.

<u>Colleen Reed</u> – Colleen Reed, ADON, came and was introduced to the committee. She explained her role as an ADON and some of her job duties.

<u>Census</u> – The census is at 126 with one possible admission today. The average Medicare patients are 10-12 per day, with an average stay of 22 days.

<u>Senior Management</u> – No meetings in a couple weeks. The 2014 budget is on track. Waiting for the final call back.

<u>Education</u> – The computer charting Care Tracker training will be taking place soon. Waiting for the dates to be confirmed.

Resident Council Meeting – Resident Council met on September 10, 2013 and minutes will be provided next month. The Gazebos are now for resident use and weekly pet visits will be starting back up.
