My experience as a Caregiver for my husband was getting quite difficult, I kept searching and making many calls until I was told about ADRC (Aging & Disability Resource Center) My Prayers were answered when I got the guidance from the many people who work there. The following is how they helped direct me:

- 1) A Support Group (helped tremendously)
- 2) Beloit Regional Hospice to help fill out all the paperwork for Power Of Attorney (Health and Finances) Living Will, also someone To care for my husband when I went to Support Group
- 3) Meetings with Step Children for informational purpose in moving forward with his progression.
- 4) Council On Aging (Grant for Respite)
- 5) Day Care Program
- 6) When his dementia progressed, a Social Worker, who helped with filling a lot of paperwork for Medicaid. Once Medicaid in place, I received many hours of care for him, to run errands, coffee with friends, (at least 6 hours a day during the week) a few hours for Church, and 24/7 for respite on weekend trips (at least 3-4 times a year.)
- 7) When I could no longer keep him at home, help with finding Placement for him.
- 8) All the years they helped me, there was fun activities and workshops for relaxation time for Caregivers. (Pizza outings, painting, Comedy Night, Christmas Lighting, Christmas show and Brunch.)

I don't think physically or mentally I would have been able to keep him home as long as I did if I hadn't received all this help.




