<u>Citizen Participation, Communications, and Announcements.</u> Mr. Paynter introduced Mr. Adler, writer, historian and photographer. Mr. Paynter and Mr. Adler donated three canvas pictures of the five arch bridge next to Turtle Creek Parkway to the Parks Department. All members of the Committee thanked Mr. Adler for the outstanding and thoughtful gifts.

Parks Advisory Board Communications. Mr. Paynter reminded members of the candlelight event February 22, 2020, on the Ice Age Trail in Milton (Vincent Street & Manogue Road) from

6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. The weather was superb for the owl walk on February 8, 2020, at Storrs Lake, Milton. Although no owls were sighted, over 100 people attended the candlelight hike.

Mr. Finney stated the Friends of Rock County Parks group received a \$500 donation. The intended use of the donation is for the well at the Gibbs Lake horse lot.

PARKS BUSINESS

<u>Discussion & Update – Parks Manager Training Request.</u> Mr. Traynor updated the committee on the county's liability concerns as it relates to the Certified Playground Safety Inspector Training. According to Rock County's Risk Manager, Ms. Carlson, the training would not cause the county further unexpected liability. Ms. Carlson stated the training will benefit DPW and Rock County and the ability to respond to hazards specific to this area of training. Renewal of certification is every three years.

<u>Discussion – Letter of Recommendation for Multi-Use Trail Group.</u> Mr. Traynor drafted the attached letter of support for the Multi-Use Trail Group grant request. The grant will aid in the purchase of a well at Gibbs Lake horse lot.

<u>Parks Manager Report – See Attached.</u> Mr. Traynor provided information on the items listed in his report.

Parks General – Equipment and Amenities Maintenance: picnic tables, event boards and a park bench need repairing. Tree work has been done at Magnolia Bluff, Miller Farm and Lee Park using the new diamond forestry mower.

POROS Plan Update – Status – Ongoing: an open house is scheduled for Tuesday, February 18, 2020, from 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. in the conference room at Rock County DPW.

Permit Acquisition – Turtle Creek Parkway: the kayak launch has been renewed. Murwin Park: the kayak launch permit has been received. Indianford Park – Vault Toilet: working on getting permits and specifically, the building permit from Fulton Township.

Park Damage Assessment – Vandalism was found at: Happy Hollow: the boat launch kiosk was egged and the plexi-glass was smashed; Sweet-Allyn: the park bench seats were broken; Gibbs Lake: the boat launch kiosk plexi-glass was broken.

Turtle Creek Parkway – FORCP Workday February 7, 2020, at Five Arch Bridge: a meeting took place between Parks, the Friends group and the landowner to address any concerns. The 5th arch is now visible from the bridge as approximately 150 feet of brush was cleared by the Friends of Rock County Parks group and the Parks Department. The use of the parus toolcat helped expedite the process.

Snowmobile Grant and Alliance Meetings – Received second payment of 2018-2019 grant \$26,644.33: this covers expenses from 2019. Received first half of 2019-2020 grant \$32,190: another payment will be received if the amount is exhausted as the grant matches dollar for dollar. Update correspondence and communication and streamline opening and closing procedures: the Parks Department met with the DNR, the Snowmobile Alliance Club and the Sheriff's Department. Communication lines have been opened and streamlined and all snow updates will be shared. The online application, *WhatsApp*, is being utilized to communicate with each group simultaneously.

Friends of Rock County Parks – Candlelight hike on Ice Age Trail is scheduled for February 22, 2020, at 6 p.m.

<u>Community Coordinator Report – See Attached.</u> Ms. Friend provided information on the items listed in her report.

The Snow Report is updated via press release, hotline, Travel Wisconsin, Facebook and the Parks website.

Ms. Friend met with the Mobility Manager for Rock County Council on Aging. Wednesday Walks are being planned and two of them will be held in Rock County Parks. Mr. Hessenauer will lead the walks.

Mr. Jorgenson stated each Department's mileage varies based on use. MOTION CARRIED.

<u>Resolution – Purchase of Three (3) 2020 Dodge Caravans.</u> Supervisors Richard and Fox moved the purchase of (3) 2020 Dodge Caravans. One vehicle is a replacement and the remaining two are for ADRC & AODA. All vehicles are within the budget. MOTION CARRIED.

Adoption of the 2020-2025 Rock County Parks, Outdoor Recreation and Open Space (POROS) Plan

WHEREAS, it is good management practice for the Rock County Parks Division to have a long range plan to assure that park planning goals, objectives, and policies are current for its operation
 and assets; and,

WHEREAS, Rock County desires to maintain its eligibility for grant funding for the acquisition and development of park and recreational facilities through State and Federal programs; and needs to update the 2015-2020 POROS Plan in order to remain eligible for State, Federal, and foundation grants, which along with local matching funds can be used to help improve the County's parks, outdoor recreation facilities, and open space areas to the benefit of Rock County Citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources requires that the County update its POROS Plan every five years to maintain such eligibility and to assure that park planning goals, objects, and policies are current; and

WHEREAS, the County has contracted with Vandewalle & Associates to prepare an update to the 2015-2020 County's POROS Plan which included a data gathering process that used extensive public participation including staff input sessions, public surveys, focus groups, and an open house; and,

WHEREAS, the 2020-2025 POROS Plan goals and priorities recommended by the Public Works, Parks Advisory, and Planning & Development Committees are based on this extensive process of public input; and,

WHEREAS, the 2020-2025 POROS plan is intended to be used by the Rock County Parks Manager, Parks Staff, and Public Works Parks Advisory Committee to pursue appropriate park, outdoor recreation and open space items and projects; and,

WHEREAS, the proposed 2020-2025 POROS Plan has been reviewed and recommended for adoption by both the Parks and Planning Department Staffs; and,

WHEREAS, the proposed 2020-2025 POROS Plan is consistent with the Rock County Comprehensive Plan 2035.

WHEREAS, the Rock County Board of Supervisors shall pursue the implementation of the Rock County 2020-2025 POROS Plan as opportunities and resources are presented and available.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Rock County Board of Supervisors duly assembled this ______ day of _______, 2020, hereby adopts the 2020-2025 Rock County Parks, Outdoor Recreation, and Open Space (POROS) Plan, to serve as the County's updated POROS plan and chapter twelve of the Rock County Comprehensive Plan 2035.

- EXECUTIVE SUMMARY -

Rock County Park, Outdoor Recreation and Open Space Plan (POROS)

In order to remain eligible for state, federal and foundation grants, Rock County needs to update the 2015-2020 POROS Plan. These grant funds, along with local matching funds can continue to be utilized to help improve the county's parks, outdoor recreation facilities, and open space areas to the benefit of Rock County citizens quality of life. The Plan has a five-year planning horizon. It will need to be updated in 2025 for the next five-year planning period.

The POROS planning process included a data gathering process that used extensive public participation including staff input sessions, community survey, focus groups, and an open house.

The proposed Rock County POROS Plan is one document and includes the following sections:

- 1) Introduction and Background Information, 2) Planning Process and Public Participation,
- 3) Existing Park and Recreational Facilities, 4) Goals, Objectives, and Policies, 5) Park and Recreation Standards, 6) Analysis of Existing Park and Recreation Facilities, 7) Recommended Park and Open Space Improvements, 8) Capital Improvements Plan, and 9) Implementation Action Plan.

We realize that this is ambitious, but without enumeration, those projects would not be eligible for grant or other funding options.

The proposed 2020-2025 POROS Plan has been reviewed and recommended for adoption by both the Parks and Planning Department Staffs. The proposed POROS Plan update is consistent with the Rock County Comprehensive Plan 2035 and will be updated as chapter twelve of the plan.
