Overview – Armed Security

The request is to have Global Security Services, our new Security contractor as of 1/1/2019, provide armed officers verses unarmed officers. Global has provided armed officers for many government military contracts as well as a federal district court. Their references came back very positive. The officers are well trained and their weapons qualifying follow the Wisconsin standards as is the Rock County Sheriff's Office deputies.

- ➤ The increased cost is \$13,000 and leaves us within budget.
- The Sheriff's Office does support having armed officers at the Courthouse screening station. Stating if the cost was not so expensive they would prefer Sheriff's deputies. They have reviewed Global Security's policy and procedures and were comfortable with those. Global Security will work with the Sheriff's Office to adopt working procedures consistent with the Sheriff's Office.
- ➤ 11-28-18 I reviewed it with the Court Security and Facilities Committee. Corporation Counsel suggested the Sheriff's Office review Global Security's use of force policy. This was reviewed and approved by the Sheriff's Office. Most of the attendees through their comments expressed support for the use of armed Sheriff's Deputies and recommended taking it to the next judges meeting to be reviewed by all the Judges.
- > 12-1-18 It was reviewed by all Judges and through their comments a majority expressed support for armed officers (security or Sheriff's Deputies). Judge Dillion requested Theresa Owens, District Court Administrator, get feedback what the other Circuit Courts are doing. Theresa reported back with the following Circuit Courts provide armed Sheriff's Deputies-Sheboygan, Winnebago, Marathon, Outagamie and Fond du Lac will do the same. Racine County uses armed retired Sheriff's deputies. Brown, Kenosha, Walworth and La Crosse do not have armed officers. One Judge also requested how many incidents occurred in Rock County Courthouse last year. There were a total of 16 incidents in 2018 (summary attached).

- ➤ County Administration wants to make sure everyone is aware armed security could have a negative impact on some courthouse users, including disadvantaged populations. (ex: The City of Janesville was going to use the Janesville police station for a voting location. Some raised concerns because of negative interactions with law enforcement). Concerns include perceptions of the lack of openness and inclusiveness of the County/Courthouse that may inhibit resident access, as well as increasing the possibility for confrontation between upset residents and armed security guards.
- > 1-7-19 & 1-21-19- was reviewed by the Public Safety & Justice Committee. A majority of the committee expressed through their comments support of armed security guards. There was a request to obtain staff and citizen input.
- Cost for Rock County Sheriff's deputies to perform the contracted security duties including 4,440 hours M-F would be \$176,772 annual cost for 2019. The cost for Global Security Services armed officers would be \$85,570.44.



Project Description:

GSS provides armed uniformed security officers for six (6) Army National Guard Installations throughout Illinois. Officers ensure the safety of employees, protect the property of the State by providing services in support of post patrol, access control points, security enforcement, vehicular traffic flow, and vehicle inspections in accordance with the federal, state, local, Department of Defense (DOD), and applicable force protection conditions to include random antiterrorism measures.

Officers deter, detect and detain persons suspected of committing other offenses such as operating a vehicle under the influence of alcohol or other drug, driving a motor vehicle on any DMA facility with a suspended/revoked license, and illegal transport of drugs/explosive materials/weapons.

OFFICER SELECTION AND SCREENING PROCESS

As a military contractor currently serving 10 US Army Installations and 2 Federal facilities we strictly adhere to AR190-56 (Army Civilian Police and Security Program). As a vendor, we represent the organization we protect and are often the first impression military or civilian personnel have with the facility. A sloppy uniform, unshaven or unkempt officer is the wrong type of first impression. We take pride in our uniform appearance. In order to ensure this, we seek to attract and retain only the most qualified security personnel available in each area we serve. We do so by offering an industry leading pay sale and benefits package second to none. Our process of quality control begins with our rigorous selection and screening process which serves to weed out candidates who may not be suited for such a sensitive position or who fail to meet our strict experience requirements.

All candidates must have a minimum of 2 years of prior security experience, 2 years of post-secondary education, or a combination of the two, in order to move forward in our selection and screening process. If they meet our strict experience requirements, candidates are further screened by means of in-depth interviews by at least two management team members. The interviewers question the candidate's past experience, attitude, and character to determine their suitability for employment. If a candidate passes, individuals are subject to a criminal background check at the local and State level and tested for substance abuse. After completion of the screening process, candidates go through our Certified Officer Response Education program (C.O.R.E) which incorporates a vast array of training material to ensure the maximum effectiveness from our security personnel and to reduce liability. *Our average qualification per team member calculates to over 7 years' experience and more than one year of higher education*.

Our comprehensive training program includes a combination of classroom, tactical and handson training provided by experienced private security and law enforcement instructors. Due to the sheer volume of information, it would be un-realistic to include the documents with this RFP. However, we have provided an outline of some of the material covered through classroom lecture and actual hands on training.






OFFICER SALARY AND BENEFITS (QUALITY VS QUANTITY)

Our attractive wage structure enables us to recruit from a pool of highly qualified security professionals in the areas we operate. Typically, our pay structure allows us to pick from the best available personnel in a given area which has attributed greatly to our success. In general, turnover in our industry is very high. This is due to many factors, but in our opinion, it is the fact that wages are *horrible*, benefits are unaffordable if offered and advancement opportunity is next to zero. The security industry as a whole has an annual attrition rate between 100-300%. In contrast, our attrition rate is 32%. So, why is ours so low? Simply put, because we pay our team members a living wage, we pay for 77% of the team member's health insurance coverage, provide initial and ongoing training to ensure officer's safety and we truly care about our team members. In fact, we don't refer to our personnel as employees. They are members. This is because we are all on the same team. This sense of membership combined with a living wage allows officers to stay with us because they can meet their family obligations and grow with our team professionally.
