Supervisor Zajac moved approval of the above Bills/Encumbrances and Pre-Approved Encumbrances for the General Services Committee, second by Supervisor Brien. ADOPTED.

Approval to Include Bidders Qualification Statement in the Following Bid Packages:

Pinehurst Waterproofing; Health Care Center Masonry Repairs; and Courthouse Parking

Ramp Masonry Repairs, North Planter and Light Base Reconstruction. Mr. Leu said this is the same format as the Jail and asked for approval to proceed with the bidding procedure for the three projects.

Supervisor Brien moved approval to include the bidders qualification statement for the three projects, second by Supervisor Zajac. ADOPTED.

Update.

<u>Courthouse Windows Project</u> Mr. Leu informed the Committee that Ms. Timmerman, Deputy Corporation Counsel, sent a letter to Alcoa requesting the cost for replacement of all windows not currently covered under the warranty. Alcoa misinterpreted the letter and said they would only fix the windows that have failed. Ms. Timmerman has sent a letter back explaining that the County would cover the cost difference for the additional windows over the ones that have failed. She has not yet heard back from them.

Courthouse Planters Mr. Leu said there is nothing new at this time.

<u>Communications, Announcements and Information.</u> Supervisor Zajac suggested using a concrete sealer around the planters that are failing. Mr. Leu said this was a good idea.

Executive Session: Supervisors Zajac and Brien moved to go into Executive Session at 8:06 A.M. per Section 19.85(1)(d) Wis. Stats. - Consider Strategy for Crime Detection or Prevention (Recommendation on Courthouse Security). ADOPTED on a roll call vote with the following: Ayes – Supervisors Brill, Brien and Zajac. Supervisors Heidenreich and Nash were absent.

Chair Brill announced that the Committee would meet in closed session per Section 19.85(1)(d) Wis. Stats. – Consider Strategy for Crime Detection or Prevention (Recommendation on Courthouse Security).

Supervisor Zajac moved to go out of Executive Session at 9:14 A.M., second by Supervisor Brien. ADOPTED.

Tour of the Courthouse. The Committee toured the courthouse from 9:15 to 9:45 A.M.

Mr. Smith said there will be more discussion at the next General Services meeting.

Mr. Leu said he would do a flow chart of the phases to show the cause and effects for each change.
