# AUTHORIZING APPLICATION WITH WISCONSIN DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES FOR SNOWMOBILE GRANT FUNDS

This resolution provides authorization to apply for funding for the 2015-2016 Rock County Snowmobile Trail Program.

The DNR Snowmobile Grant of \$56,600 would cover 226.4 miles of trail. The snowmobile trail project is 100% grant funded. Any field work (includes labor, materials, and machinery) by DPW Parks Division or Highway Division is 100% billed back to the grant. The area Snowmobile Alliance provides trail signage and grooming and is reimbursed for those services after the county costs are covered.

These funds are 100% provided by the payments snowmobilers have made through license and prorated fuel tax payments. Rock County receives a 50% advance payment check after the completed contract is signed, the balance due upon final close out of the grant.

# EXECUTIVE SUMMARY ACCEPTANCE OF WISCONSIN DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES COUNTY FISH AND GAME PROJECT GRANT FUNDS

Each Wisconsin County is allocated a certain amount of money annually to fund small projects on a 50/50 match basis. This year we will use our \$2,600 of allocated funds to help pay for invasive species control at Magnolia Bluff Park, which will include expanding our annual herbicide treatment and prescribed burn land management programs.

Though this funding source requires a 50% match by the County, all time and materials supplied by the Parks and Highway Divisions, as well as other community resources, may be used as in-kind match.

#### Opposition to Freezing the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program Fund

WHEREAS, the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program has been providing money to the state, local governments, land trusts and other non-profits (NGOs) to purchase and protect land since 1989. It has helped protect more than 500,000 acres. These lands benefit all of us in Wisconsin by providing jobs, supporting local economies, protecting our water resources & air quality, promoting tourism & healthy lifestyles, guaranteeing places to hunt, hike, fish and explore close to home; and,

WHEREAS, the Public Works Parks Division has utilized the stewardship fund in the recent past as an alternative funding source for various park projects and planned to utilize this fund for future park projects within Rock County. Past and future projects included or would include land acquisition and park development projects; and,

WHEREAS, the Land Conservation Department (LCD) identified the stewardship fund as an alternative funding source for the Purchase of Agricultural Conservation Easement (PACE) Program for lands that fell within the Department of Natural Resources' (DNR) leased Public Hunting Program areas located in Rock County; and,

WHEREAS, the LCD and DNR were committed to the development of a partnership for protecting the working lands of Rock County, through the PACE Program, while facilitating DNR interests of increasing public access opportunities within the public hunting areas; and,

WHEREAS, the proposed freeze on the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program Fund dissolves this partnership, slows the progress of protecting working lands and slows the ability of the DNR increasing public access to private lands for hunting and fishing opportunities; and,

WHEREAS, the Planning & Development Committee recommended and the County Board adopted policies in the Rock County Comprehensive Plan 2035 to protect agricultural and natural resources with viable and useful implementing tools such as the stewardship fund; and,

WHEREAS, the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program Fund has been used by land trusts and other NGOs to purchase conservation easements in Rock County for the protection of working lands and natural areas; and,

WHEREAS, the Public Works Committee, the Land Conservation Committee, and Planning and Development Committee have stated their opposition to freezing the stewardship funds as identified in the Governor's proposed 2015-2017 budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Rock County Board of Supervisors duly assembled this \_\_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_\_, 2015, urges Governor Scott Walker to reconsider the proposed freeze to the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Fund and requests the Wisconsin State Senate and Assembly to take action which maintains the stewardship fund in its entirety; and.

Opposition to Freezing the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program Fund

#### Opposition to Freezing the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program Fund

#### **Executive Summary**

Governor Walker has proposed to freeze the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program Fund until 2023, as introduced in the 2015 – 2017 State Budget proposal. The Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program Fund is available each year in the form of grants to local units of government and nonprofit conservation organizations. These grants help fund land acquisition and recreational development statewide. This fund has helped protect over 500,000 acres of natural areas and working lands since its inception in 1989. Rock County, local units of government and nonprofit conservation organizations have relied on the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program Fund to provide critical financial support for past, present and future projects.

The Rock County Public Works Department Parks Division has utilized this fund for park improvement projects and to add land to the County Park System. The Parks Division was granted funds from the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program Funds to complete many of the projects in the Beckman Mill County Park. All projects are outlined in the County's Park Revitalization Plan. By securing this funding the Park Division was able to secure funding from additional grant sources and matching County funds. As a direct result of the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship funds, the vast network of volunteers associated with this park provided in-kind contributions that led to the completion of projects making this park what it is today.

In addition the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program Funds were utilized by nonprofit conservation organizations such as the Green-Rock Audubon Society for the purchase of lands in the Town of Newark on the East Branch of Raccoon Creek. The lands have had extensive work completed by volunteers resulting is a beautiful natural area. Another example of NGOs working in Rock County is the Natural Heritage Land Trust used these funds to facilitate the acquisition of land adjacent to the DNR's Avon Bottoms Wildlife Area in Avon Township.

The Rock County Land Conservation Department has been working with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to develop a formal partnership to preserve productive agricultural lands in conjunction with providing recreational access (hunting) in the proximity of Evansville, Footville, and Orfordville. The Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program Fund would have been used to reduce the County's fiscal exposure as it relates to the Purchase of Agriculture Conservation Easements (PACE).

The Rock County Comprehensive Plan 2035 directs the County to ensure the viability of agricultural and natural resources. Adopted policies were designed to support efforts to preserve and protect these important regional elements including seek funding opportunities through partnerships.

As stated earlier, the proposal as submitted by Governor Walker in the 2015 - 2017 State Budget, is to freeze this fund until 2023. The Public Works, Land Conservation, and Planning and Development Committees have discussed this issue and are opposed to the proposal.

# EXECUTIVE SUMMARY AUTHORIZING SALE OF EASEMENT TO WISCONSIN POWER AND LIGHT COMPANY, DBA ALLIANT ENERGY TO INSTALL A NATURAL GAS REGULATOR STATION AT THE HIGHWAY 59 GARAGE

The Rock County Public Works Department received a request from Wisconsin Power and Light Company to obtain a permanent easement for the installation of a natural gas regulator station. The proposed easement is in the southwest corner of a Rock County owned parcel, where the Highway 59 Garage and salt storage are located.

With the upcoming I-39/90 road construction work at the State Trunk Highway 59 (STH 59) interchange, Wisconsin Power and Light needs to relocate their existing natural gas regulator station located south of STH 59 at the intersection of N. Hemenway Lane and STH 59. This regulator station provides service to the area west of I-39/90 from a main gas line located there. Wisconsin Power and Light is proposing the installation of a new natural gas regulator station in order to maintain service to the areas previously mentioned. The easement is 12 feet by 20 feet (0.011 Acres).

The regulator station should not interfere with current or future operations of the Department of Public Works at the 1.0 acre site.

Wisconsin Power and Light is agreeable to compensating Rock County \$851.50 for the easement. This value is based on land value information obtained from the Wisconsin Department of Transportation.
