## "Healthful Hint" Monthly Health News Column

#### How Dangerous is Secondhand Smoke?

We have all likely heard about the dangers of cigarette smoking. It is the leading cause of lung cancer in the United States, and harms nearly every organ of the body. But just how dangerous is secondhand smoke, particularly to children?

Secondhand smoke comes from lit cigarettes and cigars. It also comes from smoke breathed out by smokers. When children breathe in secondhand smoke, it is like they are smoking, too.

Why is secondhand smoke so dangerous? Scientists studied what chemicals and poisons are found in tobacco smoke. Here are just a few of the chemicals and poisons the scientists found:

- **Benzene:** Found in gasoline.
- Butane: Used in lighter fluid.
- Ammonia: Used in household cleaners.
- Toluene: Found in paint thinners.
- Cadmium: Used in making batteries.
- Hydrogen Cyanide: Used in chemical weapons.

Tobacco smoke harms babies, even before they are born. One in every five babies born to mothers who smoke has low birth weight. Low birth weight is a leading cause of infant death. It harms children, too, because their lungs and bodies are still growing. Babies and children who breathe secondhand smoke are sick more often with bronchitis, pneumonia, and ear infections.

Smoking outside or in another room won't help either. Smoking in another room like a bedroom or bathroom pollutes all the air in your home. In an apartment, smoke in one room can go through the whole building. Smoking outside in a hall or stairwell does not protect the children inside. Smoke goes under doors, windows and through cracks. To protect children inside, homes and apartments must be smoke-free.

**No amount of secondhand smoke is safe.** What can you do to protect children from secondhand smoke? Follow these recommendations from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

- Ask people not to smoke around your children.
- Support family and friends who also want to stop smoking.
- Decide to have a smoke-free home and car, and ask family and friends to respect your decision.
- Get rid of all ashtrays in your home.
- Teach your children to stay away from secondhand smoke. Encourage your teens not to smoke.
- Make the decision to quit smoking. Get help from your doctor, family, and friends. Call this free quitline: 1-800-QUIT-NOW.

As adults, we have the power to protect our children from the dangers of secondhand smoke. Children respect and learn from your actions and words. As caregivers, we teach our children by the choices we make.

#### **Rock County Rabies Awareness Week**

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Rabies is a fatal disease that is present in the wildlife of Rock County. While much more common in developing countries, this disease is rare in the United States only because we vaccinate our pet cats and dogs for rabies. Vaccinating our pets creates a zone of safety between the rabies in the wildlife and human populations. While approximately 400 animals bite people each year in Rock County, many more animal bites go undocumented. Only 50% of cats and dogs in the documented animal bites are vaccinated for rabies. Declaring Rock County Rabies Awareness Week will alert the community to this public health concern. Keeping your pet current on their rabies vaccinations is being a responsible pet owner and protects both your family and your pet.
