<u>Staff Members Present</u>: Josh Smith, County Administrator; Randy Terronez, Assistant to County Administrator; Annette Mikula, Human Resources Director; Bridget Laurent, Deputy Corporation Counsel.

<u>Approval of Agenda</u>. Supervisor Yeomans moved approval of the agenda as presented, second by Supervisor Bostwick. ADOPTED.

Supporting Affordable Higher Education and Lower Student Debt

"NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Rock County Board of Supervisors, on this ____ day of _____, 2019, does hereby direct the Department of Human Resources to ensure each employee is notified annually that they may be eligible for public service loan forgiveness of federal direct loans repaid during their employment with Rock County and that the Department of Human Resources is further directed to, upon request for an employee, complete any necessary paperwork to provide proof of employment to those employees who are eligible.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Rock County Board of Supervisors urges Congress to adopt legislation which would allow borrowers to refinance existing student loan debt to address the growing student loan debt crisis.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Rock County Board of Supervisors urges the State Legislature to support the state Higher Ed. Lower Debt bill, which would allow borrowers to refinance loans and create a tax break for state residents actively paying back student loans.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Rock County Board of Supervisors urges state and federal leaders to pursue additional solutions to the student debt burden, including policies that invest in the Pell grant program, reduce interest rates for future loans, and ensure tuition is affordable.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Clerk be authorized and directed to send a copy of this resolution to Governor Evers, the office of each member of Congress representing the citizens of Wisconsin, and the Wisconsin Counties Association."

Supervisor Brill moved approval of the above resolution, second by Supervisor Thomas.

Executive Summary

Rock County created a new position of Master Electrician in the 2019 budget. We recently completed a recruitment for this position and was unsuccessful in finding a highly qualified, experienced candidate in our pay range. The applicant pool was small even though we advertised through the local International Brothers of Electrical Workers and our County website.

Human Resources conducted a salary analysis for local Master Electrician positions and found that Rock County maximum of \$69,968.88 was below average for wage and benefits in this area.

As a result of the salary comparison it is recommended to reallocate the position of Master Electrician from the current placement in range 21 to range 23. The new range for the position would be \$61,616.92 to \$74,875.68.

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Department of Children and Families awarded Rock County \$62,500 in start-up funds and an additional \$125,009 to develop a Family Drug Treatment Court (FDTC) for parents involved in Child Protective Services; and,

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WHEREAS, a Family Drug Treatment Court is an integrated model in which a specialized court docket, composed of a treatment team (e.g., judge, client, corp. counsel, social worker, CASA, substance abuse therapist, etc.) work together to support recovery and monitor progress of participants. An integrated, collaborative approach will contribute to the increased success of parents engaging in recovery services; and,

WHEREAS, the first six months of the grant is a planning and development phase. The FDTC is projected to start accepting clients at the end of July 2019; and,

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WHEREAS, the target population served by this project are families involved with CPS who have a substance abuse disorder and a dispositional CHIPS court order; and,

WHEREAS, the long term goals of the FDTC are to increase successful reunification, reduce length of stay in foster care, and increase access to recovery services for parents; and,

WHEREAS, a vacant position in CPS Ongoing will be reallocated to a Lead Case Manager to fulfill the role of the FDTC Coordinator/Case Manager. Funding to cover the reallocation this year will come from CPS vacancies; and,

The Wisconsin Department of Children and Families awarded Rock County \$62,500 in start-up funds and an additional \$125,009 to develop a Family Drug Treatment Court (FDTC) for parents involved in Child Protective Services. A FDTC is an integrated model in which a specialized court docket, composed of a treatment team (e.g., judge, client, corp. counsel, social worker, substance abuse therapist, etc.) work together to support recovery and monitor progress of participants. An integrated, collaborative approach for parents with substance abuse issues, will contribute to more success in engagement with recovery services.

The grant award funds a 1.0 FTE case manager and associated costs of the position. The funding will also support enhanced treatment services, incentives, and drug testing.

Fairgrounds Cell Tower Proposal

There are two cell towers at the County fairgrounds. Attachment #1 shows the annual revenue of approximately \$33,000 and future years' revenue generates under the contracted annual 3-3.5 % escalators.

Lease Advisors, a cell tower broker has contacted the County with a proposal for both Fairgrounds cell towers, the highlights are:

- 1. Term: 30 Years and then reverts back to the County
- 2. Payment:
 - a. Lump Sum amount: \$935,225
 - b. Installment payments totaling \$1,056,000

1st Year: \$200,000

2nd thru 4th years: \$285,000

Attachment #2 is the proposal. (Note that Lease Advisors has since corrected the error in the dollar amount.)

Payment Option A would provide the County with approximately 18 years of revenue under the current revenue stream. This would leave the County "out" of 12 years revenue amounting to \$878,660.

Payment Option B would provide the County with approximately 21 years of revenue under the current revenue stream. This would leave the County "out" of 9 years revenue amounting to \$744,449.

It is recommended that the County decline the offer due the negative revenue impact.
