Support LRB 3342/1 to Increase State's Minimum Wage

"NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Rock County Board of Supervisors duly assembled this __ day of _____, 2019 does hereby support LRB 3342-1 that would in part, increase the State's minimum wage, gradually increasing over a five-year period to \$15 per hour.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Clerk be authorized and directed to send a copy of this resolution to Governor Evers, the Wisconsin Counties Association and the Rock County Legislative Delegation."

Supervisor Brien moved approval of the above resolution, second by Supervisor Zajac.

Supervisor Schulz said this would allow for an increase over a five-year period; starting rate of \$8.50 per hour, \$10, \$11.50, \$13, \$14 and \$15 increased each year accordingly. She said cost of living flexibility is built in. The legislature would set the guidelines. Supervisor Sweeney said he does not understand why this would apply to minor employees. Supervisor Schulz said they may be out on their own trying to make a living. Supervisor Sweeney said the current market has left this resolution behind.

ADOPTED on the following vote: YES – Supervisors Bostwick, Purviance, Brien, Leavy, Podzilni and Zajac. NO – Supervisors Peer and Sweeney. ABSENT – Supervisor Yeomans.

Banning Display of Confederate Flag

"NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Rock County Board of Supervisors duly assembled this __ day of _____, 2020, does hereby ban the display of the confederate flag by County staff on county-owned or county-leased property in order to promote racial healing and create a welcoming environment for all of the County's residents."

Supervisor Zajac moved approval of the above resolution, second by Supervisor Leavy.

Supervisor Sweeney asked what would happen to an employee if they were to display a confederate flag. Ms. Mikula said there would be an investigation with possible discipline. He asked if we have ever had a problem with this before. Ms. Mikula and Mr. Smith said they are not aware of this being a problem in the past. Supervisor Leavy said he believes it is better to be proactive than reactive.

ADOPTED on the following vote: YES – Supervisors Leavy, Sweeney, Brien, Bostwick, Purviance, Zajac, Podzilni and Peer. ABSENT – Supervisor Yeomans.

Authorizing Hazard Pay for Additional Departments COVID-19 Risk

"NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Rock County Board of Supervisors, duly assembled this __ day of _____, 2020, does hereby authorize payment of \$500 as noted above who have worked on-site between March 24, 2020 and the date of this Resolution is approved. Said hazard pay would be disbursed as a single lump sum at an approximate cost of \$91,000 with funds to come from the General Fund Balance.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that County staff provide a budget reconciliation/budget amendment resolution of the funds expended no later than the end of December, 2020."

Supervisor Leavy moved approval of the above resolution, second by Supervisor Brien.

Supervisor Beaver said she was told the employees on this resolution were considered for the first resolution but later removed due to the price tag of the resolution.

ADOPTED.

Discussion and Possible Action

<u>Discussion of Policy 5.52: Workplace Attire (Requirements to Wear Face Masks)</u> Ms. Mikula explained the current Rock Rebound Plan to the committee. Rock Haven and Courts have a current mask policy. CDC is suggesting the use of face masks. Supervisor Leavy agreed that there needs to be consistency amongst departments. Mr. Smith said he is leaning toward the recommendation of mask wearing by employees and public entering County facilities.

Naming of the County Owned Building at 1717 Center Ave. Mr. Smith explained the naming resolution process. He said it has been suggested to add the name 'Daniel Hale Williams' to the already suggested name of the Rock County Resource Center. Mr. Smith provided the background on Dr. Williams. Mr. Sutherland explained how the naming suggestions were gathered. There was a total of 107 names submitted. The only request from the Human Services Board was the name have the word "Resource" in it. The General Services Committee has suggested the name, Rock County Resource Center, as it easily explains the function of the building. Supervisor Brien said the General Services Committee suggested that we reach out to surviving family to get their feelings on this. Mr. Smith said they will continue to gather information on this.

MISSION STATEMENT



The mission of the Rock County Sheriff's Office is to enhance the quality of life in Rock County by working cooperatively with the public to enforce the law, preserve the peace, reduce the fear of crime and provide for a safe environment. Also, through the effective operation of the Rock County Jail, we must provide a safe, secure and humane environment for those persons committed to our custody. To accomplish this mission, we are committed to a set of values that guide our work and decisions and help us contribute to the quality of life in Rock County. We, the members of the Rock County Sheriff's Office, are committed to these values:

HUMAN LIFE - We revere human life and dignity above all else.

INTEGRITY - We believe that integrity is the basis for personal and public trust.

<u>LAWS AND CONSTITUTION</u> - We believe in the principles embodied in the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of the State of Wisconsin. We recognize the authority of federal, state and local laws.

<u>EXCELLENCE</u> - We strive for personal and professional excellence, dedication to duty and service to the public.

<u>ACCOUNTABILITY</u> - We are accountable to each other and to the citizens we serve who are the source of our authority.

<u>COOPERATION</u> - We believe that cooperation among ourselves, members of the community, government entities, and other law enforcement agencies will enable us to combine our diverse backgrounds, skills and styles to achieve common goals.

PROBLEM SOLVING - We are most effective when we help identify and solve community problems.

OFFICE OF SHERIFF

Sheriffs in the State of Wisconsin have been viewed as the top law enforcement officer within the County. Of all the offices elected from the entire County, the Sheriff has among the widest assigned and implied responsibilities which are mostly defined by State Statutes.



The office of Sheriff was created by the State of Wisconsin Constitution (Article VI, Section 4, County Officers). As a constitutional officer, the Sheriff and his/her Deputies are sworn to uphold the Constitutions of the State and Nation. The Preamble of both Constitutions states the reason or intent of these important documents. The Wisconsin Constitution Preamble reads:

"We the people of Wisconsin, grateful to Almighty God for our freedom, in order to secure its blessing, form a more perfect government, insure domestic tranquillity and promote the general welfare, do establish this constitution."

The office of Sheriff created in our State Constitution is the governmental entity established to "insure domestic tranquillity and promote the general welfare" of the County's citizens.

The Rock County Sheriff and appointed Deputies have the general authority to enforce State Statutes and ordinances of the County. Deputies may also enforce town or other municipal ordinances if established under law. The authority to act as a Deputy Sheriff may be extended beyond jurisdictional boundaries pursuant to mutual aid agreements [175.46(1)(6) or requests 66.0313].

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WHEREAS, the Chippewa Valley Regional Airport successfully appealed to the City of Eau Claire, WI to amend their local ordinance and exclude their Airport Runways and Taxiways from being charged storm water fees.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

City of Janesville Storm Water Ordinance Exemption

The Southern Wisconsin Regional Airport is a public-use, Large General Aviation airport. The Airport provides runways, taxiways, and associated parking aprons, maintained and certified within the Federal Aviation Regulation Part 139 standards. The Airport conducted 55,000 operations in 2019 and has an economic impact to the surrounding community of \$63 million dollars. The Airport relies on the Rock County tax levy to operate.

Since 2007, the Southern Wisconsin Regional Airport lies within the city limits of Janesville. As such, the Airport pays utility fees on a quarterly basis to the City. In 2016, MSA Professional Services was contracted on behalf of the Airport to respond to proposed changes in the City of Janesville's storm water utility program scheduled to take effect July 1, 2017. The study identified the Airport's total number of Equivalent Residential Units (ERU) measured on all airport properties was found to be 2,262.4. This was an increase from the 1,882.3 value in the City's storm water utility database. However, the MSA report also stated that no airport runoff is conveyed to City-owned or managed storm water infrastructure.

The Airport has seen a significant rise each year in storm water fees since that study. The total amount paid in 2017 was \$36,211.04, 2018 was \$59,603.89, and 2019 was \$75,182.80. The estimated total this year will be \$96,681.78 or an increase of 160% since 2017 despite receiving maximum allowable ERU credit.

This resolution requests the Rock County Board of Supervisors to support an initiative similar to the Chippewa Valley Regional Airport. That Airport approached the City of Eau Claire, WI to amend their city ordinance and allow an exemption of their airport runways and taxiways improved surfaces from being used to calculate storm water fees. The action was approved and resulted in significant utility savings to the Airport.

Executive Summary

Amending the 2020 HSD Budget to Accept CLTS Funds and Creating 2.0 FTE Human Services Professional Positions

This resolution authorizes HSD to create 2.0 FTE CLTS HSD Professionals. These positions will be responsible for coordinating services for children in Rock County who have a disability and are eligible for the Children's Long Term Support (CLTS) Waiver Program. The increase in case managers will help us to meet the Waitlist Elimination Requirement set by the Wisconsin Department of Health Services, Division of Medicaid Services, Bureau of Children's Services.

CLTS has been mandated by the State of Wisconsin to make progress towards opening children from the waitlist and has made funding available to immediately enroll new eligible children in CLTS that have been placed on a waitlist. Rock County CLTS has made significant progress since the initial goal of waitlist elimination in November, 2017. The total eligible children served at that time was 207 with an additional 183 on the waitlist. The total currently served in July, 2020 is 520 eligible children with an additional 80 children on the waitlist.

The resolution authorizes this position along with the equipment and furnishings necessary for the each staff.
