GENERAL SERVICES COMMITTEE Minutes – August 5, 2014

<u>Call to Order</u>. Chair Brill called the meeting of the General Services Committee to order at 8:00 A.M., Tuesday, August 5, 2014 in Conference Room N-1, Fifth Floor, Courthouse-East.

<u>Public Hearing – Courthouse Tower Project.</u> Chair Brill opened the public hearing at 8:01 A.M.

Mr. Leu said there were a list of options handed out prior to the meeting. Five of these are long term options and the sixth option is to tear it down.

Chair Brill said the Committee would listen to public comments, then make a recommendation to County Board.

Ms. Wood, 119 S. Wisconsin, Janesville, said she spoke to a number of people who live in the area and the comments were: #1 they didn't care if the tower comes down or not; #2 some of the people don't care for the design at all. She said the tower does not have a purpose, if it is torn down it will not change the character of the building. She added that it was a design element that did not work. She said she was a County Board Supervisor at the time the courthouse was being built and that many of the Supervisors felt coerced into voting on the design with the tower. She said the aesthetic, as well as cost effective value would be to tear the tower down.

Chair Brill asked if anyone else wished to speak. No one wished to speak.

Chair Brill closed the public hearing at 8:10 A.M.

<u>Design Services for Health Care Center Masonry Project - \$6.000</u> Mr. Leu said this request is to hire Engineer, Lynn Lauersdorf to prepare the plans and specifications for masonry repairs on the Health Care Center. The specifications will include tuck-pointing, crack repair, and some brick replacement. An alternate bid to remove the smoke stack will also be part of the specifications. He said this project is budgeted.

Supervisor Heidenreich moved approval to hire Lynn Lauersdorf to prepare the plans and specifications for the masonry repairs on the Health Care Center in the amount of \$6,000, second by Supervisor Brien. ADOPTED.

Design Services for Courthouse, North Planters/Light Base & East Ramp Wall - \$5,800 Mr. Leu said this request is to hire Engineer Lynn Lauersdorf to prepare the plans and specifications for repair of the north entry planters, north entry light base, and the east parking ramp wall at the Courthouse. He said this project is budgeted.

Supervisor Zajac moved approval to hire Engineer Lynn Lauersdorf to prepare plans and specifications for repair of the north entry planters, north entry light base, and the east parking ramp wall at the Courthouse in the amount or \$5,800, second by Supervisor Heidenreich. ADOPTED.

<u>Courthouse Planters</u> Mr. Leu said, after he finishes the budget, he will get together with the electrician Gilbank Construction, who was hired to remove and restore the light fixtures, so they can do selective demolition to determine how to proceed with repairs.
