

COUNTY BOARD STAFF COMMITTEE Minutes – September 12, 2017

<u>Call to Order</u>. Chair Podzilni called the meeting of the County Board Staff Committee to order at 4:00 P.M. in Conference Room N-1 on the fifth floor of the Rock County Courthouse-East.

<u>Approval of Agenda</u>. Chair Podzilni said there was additional language in resolution 6.D. that did not belong and new copies, with this language removed, have been handed out. Supervisor Arnold moved approval of the agenda with this change, second by Supervisor Peer. ADOPTED.

Requesting State Law Change Allowing Counties the use of the Design-Build Construction Method and Update the Statutory Bidding Requirements

"NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Rock County Board of Supervisors duly assembled this ______ day of ______, 2017 does hereby request that the Rock County Legislators introduce and support legislation authorizing counties to utilize the Design-Build option.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the legislature take action to update the antiquated project limit in Sec. 59.52(29), Stats. from \$25,000 to \$250,000, and the requirement of a Class 1 notice be raised for any public work to a cost in excess of \$50,000.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Clerk is authorized to send copies of this resolution to the Rock County Legislative Delegation and the Wisconsin Counties Association to elicit support for this requested change in state law."

Supervisor Brill moved approval of the above resolution, second by Supervisor Mawhinney.

Supervisor Owens explained this has been an ongoing project since 2009 and explained how this would give counties more options, save county and taxpayer money, save time, and will make projects more competitive. He requested approval of this change so it could be included with other counties resolutions going to the Wisconsin Counties Association (WCA).

The Committee discussed removal of the amounts in the resolve clauses; a group of facility management personnel from various counties will be at the WCA annual conference to get the word out and answer questions; adding a definition of Design-Build to the Executive Summary.

Supervisor Sweeney moved to have lines 26 through 28 to read "Be it Further Resolved that the legislature take action to update Sec. 59.52(29), Wis. Stats. to mirror the statutory process in existence for state and other municipalities for public work projects, retaining the requirement for a Class 1 notice.", and to add the Design-Build definition to the Executive Summary, second by Supervisor Mawhinney. ADOPTED.

ADOPTED as amended.

<u>Update on Town of Beloit Incorporation.</u> Mr. Smith passed out copies of the City of Beloit and Town of Beloit press releases. The City of Beloit offered the Town of Beloit residents the option to annex to the City as an alternative to incorporation. The City of Beloit's press release listed the Town of Beloit's motivation to incorporate, the negative impact to Rock County, the negative impact to the region, the negative impact to the City of Beloit, the negative impact to taxpayers, and the financial comparisons. The Town of Beloit's press release was their rebuttal to the City's press release.

Mr. Smith said the Town of Beloit is currently circulating a petition to the Town of Beloit residents living east of Afton Rd. He said their next steps would be to bring it to the State Department of Administration, Circuit Court, eastside residents for a vote, then to the State Board of Incorporation. The City of Beloit would have a voice to go before the state. Mr. Smith said the County has not yet taken a position on this.

The Committee discussed the incorporation process, the monetary impact on the County, and that part of the Town of Beloit is not included in the proposed incorporation.

Chair Podzilni suggested putting this item back on the agenda for the October 10, 2017 meeting.

<u>Adjournment</u>. Supervisor Kraft moved adjournment at 5:09 pm, second by Supervisor Sweeney. ADOPTED.
