Citizen Participation, Communications and Announcements: Chuck Wilson reported that the Salvation Army's Red Kettle drive starts tomorrow. Culvers will match the donations received that day.

Sonja Heiser reported that Julie Seeman presented, "The Best Kept Secret" about the Council on Aging to an audience in Evansville of about 30 which was well received. She also stated the participants at the Senior Fair she spoke to were pleased with the event.

Staff Report:

<u>Mobility Management Update:</u> Jenny McIlhone introduced herself as the new Mobility Manager. She has been making contacts within the County to introduce herself, getting acquainted with the area and getting projects organized.

<u>Health Promotion Update:</u> Joyce Lubben stated that Judy Simonds has been hired as the part-time Health Promotion Coordinator. Ms. Simonds is a leader for the Stepping On workshop so is familiar with the workshops offered through the Council on Aging. She is recruiting leaders and scheduling the 2019 workshops.

<u>Cycling Without Age:</u> Joyce Lubben reported that the trishaws are now stored at a Public Works building. The trishaws were taken to an adult day care facility in Beloit in the fall. Participants enjoyed the opportunity.

<u>Caregiver Activities:</u> Julie Seeman shared information on the events scheduled for November and December.

<u>Elder Benefit Specialist Update:</u> Lachel Fowler reported that during Open Enrollment she has served 245 individuals, so far, with a monetary impact of \$387,036. Year-to-date she has opened 1039 cases for a monetary impact of \$1,401,187. There are still ten cases open.
