## Accepting Additional Community Transformation Grant Funding and Amending the 2013 Rock County Health Department Budget

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Rock County Health Department is a member of the 'Transform Rock County' coalition, and was awarded a Transform Wisconsin grant in 2012 in the amount of \$450,000

The three main focus areas of the grant are: 1) reducing exposure to secondhand smoke in multiunit housing; 2) improving school nutrition for children; and 3) increasing the opportunities for physical activity in our communities.

Salary and benefits for the project manager, all supplies, equipment, mileage, training, and miscellaneous expenses are being reimbursed by the grant. The grant allows for mini-grants or subcontracting to coalition members who will assist in meeting the goals of the grant.

The grant began on August 1, 2012 and continues until September 30, 2014. Rock County Health Department has been awarded an additional \$3,500 for this grant, needing to be spent by September 30, 2013.

## "Healthful Hint" Monthly Health News Column

#### Beat the Summer Heat and Hydrate!

There are many safety precautions you take in the summer, such as wearing sunscreen, helmets, and insect repellent. One thing you should also remember in the summer is drinking enough fluids to stay hydrated. Water makes up 1/2 to 2/3 of the human body. Even under normal temperatures, you lose fluids each day through breathing, sweating, and elimination. As temperatures rise, you need to pay more attention to your fluid needs. Water plays many vital roles in your body such as regulating temperature, transporting oxygen and nutrients to cells, and providing a cushion to protect tissues and organs.

If you lose more water than you take in, you may suffer from dehydration. If you wait to drink fluids until you feel thirsty, you may already be on your way to becoming dehydrated. Look for these signs to prevent dehydration:

- Mild Dehydration: thirst, headache, constipation. Normal urine should be clear to lemonade-colored. With dehydration, urine becomes dark like the color of apple juice. Cool down by moving to a shaded or air-conditioned area, remove excess clothing and apply a wet towel. For mild dehydration, push fluids such as ice chips, sips of water or popsicles.
- Severe Dehydration: dizziness, dry skin, decreased sweat, fever. Do not attempt to push fluids, which can make the condition worse. Seek immediate medical attention if you are suffering from one or more of these symptoms.

You've probably heard the rule of thumb to drink 8 glasses of water each day. This is a general rule to remind you to continue drinking fluids. The amount of fluid you need each day depends on your age, gender, physical activity level, and climate. When it is hot outside, drink more fluids regardless of your activity level. Fluids come from beverages as well as the foods you eat. The average diet consists of 80% fluid from beverages and 20% from foods. Aim for foods high in water content such as fruits and vegetables. Avoid drinks with caffeine, sugar, and alcohol, because they can actually cause you to lose more body fluid. If you must exercise, drink two to four glasses of cool, nonalcoholic fluids each hour. Also, avoid very cold drinks, which can cause stomach cramps. A sports beverage can replace the salt and minerals you lose in sweat. For a personalized amount of water you should drink, follow this easy rule: drink half your body's weight in ounces of fluid each day. For example, a 150 pound person should aim to drink at least 75 ounces (9 cups) of fluids daily.

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Remember, taking in too little or too much fluids can be dangerous. Keeping the balance of fluids is the key to having a safe, fun summer!

#### Be Prepared!

Would you be ready if there was an emergency? An emergency can happen at any time, and the likelihood that you and your family will recover often depends on the planning you do ahead of time. September is National Preparedness Month, so now is a great time to make a plan and take steps to be prepared in the future!

These four basic steps from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) are a great way to start preparing for an emergency:

- 1) Get a Kit of emergency supplies
- 2) Make a Plan for what you will do in an emergency
- 3) **Be Informed** about what might happen
- 4) Get Involved in preparing your community

Another great way to be prepared is to make an emergency kit with basic supplies you might need. Start by checking off items on the list and add to the list as needed:

Water: 1 gallon per person per day, for at least 3 days, for drinking and sanitation
Food: at least a 3 day supply of non perishable items
Pet food, extra water, and supplies for your pet
Battery-powered radio
Flashlight
First aid kit
Moist towelettes for sanitation
Manual can opener for food
Any personal prescription medications

Other tips to consider when preparing for an emergency include:

- Make an emergency contact list
- Watch television and listen to the radio for official instructions
- Have an emergency plan for your pets
- Prepare enough supplies for three days

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- Talk to your children's school and your employer about emergency plans
- Include warm clothes and blankets
- Have your vehicle's gas tank at least ½ full at all times

You never know when disaster could strike. Being prepared ahead of time will only benefit you in the case of an emergency. For more great resources on National Preparedness Month, visit Ready.gov. You can never be prepared enough!
