National Farm to School Month

If childhood obesity continues to rise, children today are likely to live shorter lives than their parents, report experts at the New England Journal of Medicine. This is why we cannot wait to address childhood obesity in Rock County. The *Transform Rock County* coalition is working together with leaders in a variety of sectors to reduce childhood obesity in our community.

Health begins where we live, work, learn and play. Practicing good eating habits is one way to live a healthier lifestyle. Our community can help children eat healthier by providing locally grown fruits and vegetables to them at school. This program is called Farm to School. Our schools are a great place to start introducing children to locally grown produce because they eat up to 40 percent of their daily calories during the school day. Kids in Farm to School programs eat 20 percent more fruits and vegetables. Children will learn better if they have nutritious, fresh food options for school meals and snacks.

Over 100 Wisconsin schools have these programs, and many more food service directors want to use local food, but they lack the resources to start or expand their program. The *Transform Rock County* coalition is excited to begin implementing Farm to School programs in school districts across Rock County. *Transform Rock County* will partner with school food service directors to provide the resources necessary to start or expand their programs.

Farm to School is a "win-win" for our community. Children win, schools win, and farmers and our community win!

Children Win!

- Fresh fruits, vegetables and other healthy foods help reduce childhood obesity.
- Children at schools with Farm to School programs are more likely to eat fruits and vegetables at lunch.
- Farm to School improves students' attitudes about fruits and vegetables, building a foundation for lifelong healthy habits.

• Overall, schools have increased meal participation as much as double when farm-fresh food is served, bringing in more funds.
