POSITION DESCRIPTION

WORKING TITLE: Positive Youth Development Extension Educator (100%)

OFFICIAL TITLE: Outreach Specialist Series

The Positive Youth Development Extension Educator serves the people and communities of Wisconsin by addressing local, statewide and national issues, improving lives through research-based education, fostering partnerships and action, and facilitating positive impacts that support:

- Thriving individuals and families;
- Effective organizations;
- Healthy and vibrant communities; and
- Strong economies.

<u>OFFICE LOCATION:</u> Rock County, UW-Extension office, 3506 N. Highway 51, Building A Janesville WI 53545

This position is located in Rock county; however location and programming coverage is contingent on county funding support and location may be reassigned to align with county and Extension programming priorities.

PRIMARY PROGRAM AFFILIATION

This position will have a primary program affiliation in the Community Youth Development Program.

INITIAL PROGRAMMING FOCUS:

This Positive Youth Development Extension Educator position will primarily serve communities in Rock County.

The Positive Youth Development Extension Educator designs, delivers, and evaluates research-based educational programming and services aligned with the position's programmatic focus. Initial programming focus will include:

- Building the capacity of community organizations (including the 4-H Program) to address needs
 that affect youth and families countywide, such as youth leadership, cultural competency, civic
 engagement, academic achievement and pathways to workforce readiness;
- Supporting the positive development of youth in their family and community environments by leading initiatives and collaborating with program-related coalitions that reflect county needs;
- Expanding access to the full range of Extension educational programming for all youth, particularly in communities that are underrepresented in positive youth programming such as racial minorities and those from low-income households;
- Engaging youth in community development and the greater community in youth development through supporting youth-adult partnerships and fostering environments that support youth organizing for community change; and

• Utilize knowledge of positive youth development, community organizing, and resiliency practice to create environments that help youth to reach their full potential.

This individual will apply the University of Wisconsin's research, education and outreach resources to address locally identified needs and opportunities.

Of course, our young people that participate in 4-H also often benefit from community opportunities offered outside the 4-H program, and programs created by PYDEE may translate into expanding access to new 4-H members and/or the formation of new clubs.

Awarding of Rock County Farm Land Rental Lease

The Rock County Farm has 385 acres that are rented out to the highest successful bidder for a given contract term. The current contract expires on December 31, 2018 and the Rock County Purchasing Department successfully solicited bids for the next contract cycle.

Five successful bids were received for the Crop Land Rental Lease which runs from January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2023. It is recommended that awarding a contract to rent the Rock County Farm Crop Land to Flemming Farm for an amount of \$252.00 per acre annually, or a total income to Rock County of \$97,020 annually.

Rock County Committee Statement on Fairgrounds

The Rock County Facilities Master Plan identifies a series of upgrades to the current fairgrounds located at 1301 Craig Avenue, Janesville, WI. The Rock County Board of Supervisors in the recent adoption of the 2019 budget took the 1st step towards enhancing the asset by allocating \$200,000 for asphalt parking replacement. The Plan calls for a range of improvements totaling from \$5 million to \$15 million, subject to various options.

Rock County Board of Supervisor Richard Bostwick, District #24 and Chairman of the Rock County Agriculture and Extension Education Committee stated, "Periodically, community conversations have looked into moving the location. Yet, the end result of each of these studies and or community discussions resulted in keeping the fairgrounds at its current location. The upgrades in the Master Plan address safety, efficiency and aesthetic issues and frankly, many of which have been neglected for far too long." The Rock County Agriculture and Extension Education Committee has oversight of the Rock County Fairgrounds.

Randy Thompson, President of the 4H Fair Association Board of Directors which utilizes the fairgrounds during July for the annual county fair stated, "From the County Fair Board perspective, we are supportive of the County's commitment to make improvements to the grounds. All the improvements will have a positive impact on our ability to maintain and grow the County Fair". He noted that the fair will be held July 23 - 28, 2019

Rock County Board of Supervisors Chairman J. Russell Podzilni stated, "Having recently reviewed the Rock County Facilities Master Plan that identifies a number of improvements to the fairgrounds, and the unanimous decision of the Agriculture and Extension Education Committee not to pursue relocation of the Rock County Fairgrounds, I have no intention of accepting a motion or resolution to move the Rock County Fairgrounds, unless something totally unexpected is presented to the County."
