WHEREAS, the nation's 3,069 counties serving more than 300 million Americans provide essential services
 to create healthy, safe and vibrant communities; and

WHEREAS, counties move America forward by providing health care, administering justice, keeping communities safe, creating economic opportunities and much more; and

WHEREAS, through National Association of Counties President Greg Cox's "Connecting the Unconnected"
 initiative, NACo is demonstrating how counties deliver "people-centered services to our residents nationwide;
 and

WHEREAS, each year since 1991, NACo has encouraged counties across the country to actively promote
 their own programs and services to the public they serve; and

WHEREAS, Rock County and all counties take pride in their responsibility to protect and enhance the health,
 welfare and safety of its residents in efficient and cost-effective ways; and

WHEREAS, Rock County Administrator's Office strives to treat citizens with courtesy and as valued
 customers. This office will be open to new ideas, learn new methods, and identify opportunities for
 operating more effectively and efficiently, including through consultation with colleagues, professional
 associations, training, and other methods of professional development; and

WHEREAS, some Rock County Departments use social media, such as Facebook, Twitter and LinkedIn, to
 connect to our residents and maximize government efficiency; and

WHEREAS, a portion of Rock County's budget is contributed to nonprofit agencies in various programs
 yearly. In 2019, a few of those agencies were the Retired and Senior Volunteer Program, YWCA of Rock
 County, Family Services of Southern Wisconsin and Northern Illinois and Court Appointed Special
 Advocates; and

WHEREAS, Council on Aging provides numerous resources to the disabled and elderly, as well as family members, neighbors, friends and caregivers alike. Through the Older American Act and

partnership with other agencies and medical community, six evidence-based health promotion programs are offered to Rock County seniors, namely Living Well with Chronic Conditions, Stepping On, Powerful

Tools for Caregivers, Healthy Eating for Successful Living in Older Adults, Lighten UP and Walk with Ease. Council on Aging further offers nutrition and meal programs, such as Home Delivered Meals,

WHEREAS, Rock County Communications Center (9-1-1) is designed to provide the most efficient method for citizens to obtain fast, effective public safety services 24 hours a day throughout the year. The

#### SUPPORTING AFFORDABLE HIGHER EDUCATION AND LOWER STUDENT DEBT

WHEREAS, as student debt has continued to climb, it is clear there is an immediate need for 1 2 action to ensure higher education remain an affordable option for students both during their college years 3 and during their repayment period; and

WHEREAS, according to the New York Federal Reserve, total student debt nationwide has 6 tripled in the past decade and now exceeds all credit card debt in the United States. Research done by One Wisconsin Institute shows that nearly thirty percent of households in the state are currently paying a student loan. Current policies prevent borrowers from being able to refinance to take advantage of low interest rates and make it nearly impossible to discharge student loans through bankruptcy; and

WHEREAS, the growing student debt burden has direct impacts on our state and local economy. 12 Residents with student loan debt were more likely to forego the purchase of a new vehicle and more likely to rent rather than own a home. Funds tied to student loan payments are not available for discretionary spending at local businesses, stalling the engine of our local economy; and

WHEREAS, in addition to borrowing, we recognize that need-based aid such as the Pell grant is essential to many students' ability to afford a college education. The federal government must find ways to strengthen and sustain this aid if education is to continue to be a path to greater equality in our community and an opportunity to ensure that every individual, regardless of socioeconomic status, has the opportunity to succeed; and

WHEREAS, it is important for student borrows to have access to a variety of repayment options 23 in order to best fit their needs and goals. Current repayment options also include a possibility of loan forgiveness after ten years of repayment during employment in public service or with a government employer. As a government employer, we must do our part to ensure employees are aware of this option and potential benefit of employment with Rock County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Rock County Board of Supervisors, on this day of , 2019, does hereby direct the Department of Human Resources to 30 ensure each employee is notified annually that they may be eligible for public service loan forgiveness of 31 federal direct loans repaid during their employment with Rock County and that the Department of Human 32 Resources is further directed to, upon request for an employee, complete any necessary paperwork to provide proof of employment to those employees who are eligible.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Rock County Board of Supervisors urges Congress to 36 adopt legislation which would allow borrowers to refinance existing student loan debt to address the growing student loan debt crisis.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Rock County Board of Supervisors urges the State Legislature to support the state Higher Ed, Lower Debt bill, which would allow borrowers to refinance loans and create a tax break for state residents actively paying back student loans.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Rock County Board of Supervisors urges state and federal leaders to pursue additional solutions to the student debt burden, including policies that invest in the Pell grant program, reduce interest rates for future loans, and ensure tuition is affordable.
