

I. Executive Summary

In August 2013, the Rock County Health Department convened the Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) Steering Committee – an interdisciplinary committee of community leaders and healthcare providers, to measure the health status of Rock County, Wisconsin residents. The committee, composed of county health officials, providers, social workers, and administrators, engaged in a series of focused discussions to create a comprehensive health assessment framework to both evaluate the healthcare infrastructure and prioritize the needs of the Rock County community. To guide the health assessment, the committee adopted the Center for Disease Control's *Mobilizing for Action through Planning and Partnerships* (MAPP) framework.

The MAPP assessments provided a comprehensive picture of the overall health status of Rock County residents as well as the resources available to improve health and quality of life. Feedback was solicited from community members using Community Health Status Assessment surveys.

Over an eleven-month period, health questionnaires were distributed to a random sample of 2000 Rock County residents. The fifty question survey covered a wide range of topics ranging from access to care, quality of life, chronic illnesses, and lifestyle factors. Response rate was 32.8% (656 surveys).

In addition to the data gathered from household surveys and focus groups, health related data was analyzed from a variety of existing resources, including the Wisconsin Department of Transportation, Wisconsin County Health Rankings, Department of Education and Wisconsin Department of Health Services. Secondary source data, when combined with the qualitative and quantitative information gathered from the MAPP assessments, provided the Steering Committee with a clear picture of what is working well in addition to identifying opportunities for improvement for the healthcare infrastructure of Rock County.

The Steering Committee reviewed results and themes from the MAPP assessments and statistical data from both the 2011 and 2014 surveys in Rock County. After discussing the data, trends, and emerging concerns, the Steering Committee reached a consensus on the following issues as priorities to address:

These priority health need areas include:

- Mental health related issues, including substance abuse and inadequate access to treatment
- Harmful lifestyle choices (e.g. obesity, smoking, and inactivity)
- Underutilization of dental health services
- Underutilization of certain preventative health screenings

Background, Data and Statistics

MENTAL HEALTH

<u>Mental Health related issues, including substance abuse and inadequate access</u> to treatment.

- Rock County ranks 62 out of 72 counties in Wisconsin for County Health Rankings.
- Leading causes for hospitalizations, excluding childbirth, include 1015 cases of psychiatric conditions.
- 36% of Wisconsin adults reported poor mental health in 2012.
- Over 6% of respondents to the Rock County Community Health Needs
 Assessment Survey reported being diagnosed with a mental illness within the
 past two years and of this group, nearly one-third believed they were unable to
 access the care they needed.
- Those who did not receive the mental health services they needed cited an
 inability to pay for a doctor's visit, inability to pay for medications, services not
 being close to home, not knowing where to go for assistance, and a lack of
 insurance coverage as the primary reasons why they did not obtain care.
- Nearly one in five adults (19%) in Rock County report inadequate social and/or emotional support, compared to the state average (17%) and national benchmark (14%).
- Rock County has a lower rate of deaths caused by suicide (13.0) compared to the state rate of 13.4 per 100,000, though it is higher than the national suicide rate of 11.8 per 100,000, respectively.
- According to the Rock County Health Rankings the ratio of the population to mental health services is 1,256:1.

HARMFUL LIFESTYLE CHOICES

Harmful Lifestyle Choices (obesity, smoking, alcohol and inactivity).

 Rock County ranks 62 out of 72 counties in Wisconsin for County Health Rankings.

Obesity

- 65% of Rock County residents are considered overweight and obese.
- 23% of adults aged 20 and over report no leisure time physical activity.
- 19% of survey respondents in Rock County stated that they are physically inactive.

 In Wisconsin, annual obesity-related medical costs were estimated at \$1.5 billion, of which almost \$626 million were Medicaid and Medicare expenditures.

Alcohol Use

- Wisconsin has the highest rates of alcohol consumption, binge drinking, heavy drinking, and alcohol abuse/dependence in the nation.
- 26% of the population in Rock County drink excessively/binge drinking.
- 27% of high school students perceive 'no' risk or 'slight' risk to harming themselves or in other ways when they have been binge drinking (5 or more alcoholic drinks).

Tobacco Use

- The percentages of adults who smoke in Rock County and in Wisconsin exceed the percentage of adults who smoke across the United States (18.1%).
- Smoking was directly related to 17% of deaths in Rock County in 2009, compared to 15% across Wisconsin.

Drug Use

- Between 2006 and 2011 Wisconsin experienced a 350% increase in heroin samples submitted to the Wisconsin State Crime Laboratory by law enforcement.
- There were 749 drug-related arrests in Rock County in 2012.
- Drug abuse was identified as the underlying or contributing cause of 20 deaths in Rock County in 2010, representing a 54% increase from the previous year.
- Approximately 1.8% of 656 survey respondents to the Community Health Needs
 Assessment survey stated that they had used cocaine, marijuana, or other illegal
 drugs in the past year.
- The ratio of the population to primary care physicians is 1,601:1.

DENTAL HEALTH SERVICES

<u>Underutilization of Dental Health Services</u>

- Rock County ranks 62 out of 72 counties in Wisconsin for County Health Rankings.
- In Wisconsin, 35% of young children ages 2-4 had a caries experience (tooth decay).
- In Wisconsin, 55% of children aged 6-8 had a caries experience (tooth decay).
- In Wisconsin, 56% of adolescents aged 15 had a caries (tooth decay) experience.

- 39.2% of adults had tooth loss due to decay or gum disease in Rock County (2006, 2008, 2010).
- In 2010, there were 838 patient visits to a hospital emergency department for non-traumatic dental complaints.
- 35 out of 67 dentists treat at least one Medicaid/BadgerCare+ patient, SFY10.
- County Oral health Wisconsin Surveillance System (COWSS) says, "Population to dentist ratio in Rock County is 2,393:1."

PREVENTATIVE HEALTH SCREENINGS

Underutilization of certain preventative health screenings

- Rock County ranks 62 out of 72 counties in Wisconsin for County Health Rankings.
- 33.2% of Rock County has never been tested for colon or rectal cancer (*adults* age 50+).
- 20.4% of Rock County men have been checked for prostate cancer (men age 50+).
- Only 40% of women visit a gynecologist on an annual basis.
- 66% of female Medicare enrollees receive mammogram screenings.
- The ratio of the population to primary care physicians is 1,601:1.

II. Implementation Plan

The following Implementation Plan is broken down into four categories listing short, medium and long term goals (objectives), recommended implementation activities, partners, measures of success and timeline.

#1. Mental Health

Theme: Mental health related issues, including substance abuse and inadequate access to treatment.

Short-term outcomes:

Goal 1: Identify mental health problems and gaps in mental health services.

Implementation Activities:

- Meet with Coroner, Criminal Justice Coordinating Council, Rock County school officials, National Alliance on Mental Illness; to gather information regarding mental health issues and services available.
- Review information about mental health problems from existing surveys completed by other agencies.

Goal 2: Increase awareness in the community about mental health problems. Provide mental health education.

Implementation Activities:

- Educate community through public service announcements, billboards, rotating mental health display throughout county.
- Provide depression education programs to senior citizens, pregnant women, school children.
- Provide stress management techniques to public.

#2. Harmful Lifestyle Choices

Theme: Harmful lifestyle choices (e.g. obesity, inactivity, alcohol, smoking, and drug use)

Short-term outcome:

Goal 1: Increase knowledge of benefits of healthy lifestyles (fruit/vegetables consumption, physical activity, smoking cessation, reduced alcohol consumption).

Implementation Activities:

- Joint nutrition and physical education efforts with schools, community garden groups and community partners; public messaging to Rock County citizens on the benefits of healthy lifestyles.
- Partner with local organizations; promote activities already being implemented in the community.
- Promote and distribute initiative and activities within the community that are already being held to increase participation.

#3. Dental Health Services

Theme: Underutilization of dental health services

Implementation Activities:

Potential partners: Rock County Health Department, Delta Dental of WI, American Dental Association, Early Childhood, Head Start, Rock County Area Schools (school registration days).

Measures of Success:
