- EXECUTIVE SUMMARY -

ENDORSING THE ROCK COUNTY BELOIT – JANESVILLE BICYCLE ROUTE FOR DESIGNATION AS A STATE TRAIL

The Rock County Parks Outdoor Recreation and Open Space Plan encourages the establishment of on-road routes and off-road trail connections within the county that improve regional transportation options for bicycles and pedestrians and at the same time enhance the value of existing and planned residential, recreational, and economic development areas in the county.

Rock County Parks has been engaged in the Beloit – Janesville Bicycle Route Corridor Master Plan and Feasibility Study, and has contributed towards the selection of preferred routes from the City of Janesville, including routes which pass through Town of Beloit-owned lands and Rock County road rights-of-way, connecting to the official City of Beloit bike trail system;

The Trail is currently under development. The off – road section that is currently completed runs from Janesville to the Town of Afton. The anticipated completion time frame for the remaining section of trail from the Town of Afton to the City of Beloit is two to five years.

Brigit Brown, DNR State Trails Director, visited the Beloit to Janesville Trail. During that visit in early 2012, State Trail designation was discussed with the trail committee. The designation process involves writing a letter of request to the WDNR. The advantage of doing this now is that it will make other funding application opportunities will be available.

This is an exciting opportunity for Rock County Parks to increase the publicity of the Beloit to Janesville Trail on a state level. The DNR will publish our parks information in their state trails materials, making this trail a tourist destination. The uncompleted sections of this trail will not be publicized on state maps until they are finished.

WHEREAS, the Rock County Board of Supervisors Resolution 12-6B-063, on the 28th day of June, 2012, adopted the Magnolia Bluff Park Master Plan; and,

WHEREAS, during the development of this plan, the Public Works & Parks Advisory Committee worked with the Magnolia Bluff Steering Committee, the Rock County Multi-Use Trail Group, the National Park Service, the Ice Age Trail Alliance and the general public to collect input and feedback on park improvements and priorities laid out in the Magnolia Bluff Park Master Plan; and,

WHEREAS, the 2013 adopted County budget contained matching funds to renovate the trails at Magnolia Bluff Park for public outdoor recreation purposes as described in the Magnolia Bluff Park Master Plan; and,

WHEREAS, the project is funded in part by DNR Recreation Trails Stewardship grant funds pursuant to provisions of s.23.09(12) of the Wisconsin Statutes and is authorized by county board resolution 12-3B-623 on the 22nd day of March, 2012 to renovate the trails at Magnolia Bluff Park for public outdoor recreation purposes as described in the application; and,

WHEREAS, matching grant funds totaling \$54,738 were awarded from the Wisconsin DNR; and,

WHEREAS, Rock County Parks Staff prepared specifications and the County Purchasing Division requested proposals for the trail renovation project; and,

WHEREAS, Purchasing and Parks staff reviewed all proposals received and are recommending that the contract be awarded to the low bidder, Ultimate Excavating.

- EXECUTIVE SUMMARY -

AUTHORIZING AWARD OF CONTRACT FOR MAGNOLIA BLUFF PARK TRAIL IMPROVEMENTS

Rock County is the owner of the Magnolia Bluff County Park and has been awarded matching grant money for a trail renovation project through the Recreation Trails Stewardship Grant Funds Program by the DNR. This project includes several different types of improvement/maintenance projects. It also includes an ADA-compliant trail, not only to meet accessible route standards, but also to provide an accessible trail experience for individuals with disabilities.

The project includes:

- 1. Closing trail sections that have erosion and accessibility issues and establishing new trail segments to complete the trail system.
- 2. As part of the trail reconstruction, creating several interlocking trail loops that can be followed using a map and park signage.
- 3. Building ADA-compliant hard surface crushed limestone trails along the lower and upper parking areas, connecting the existing wells, existing bathrooms, and trail entrances to accessible parking stalls.
- 4. Building a trail loop that is accessible to all users. The proposed loop was chosen because it connects the park's main facilities, best views, and the existing natural grade has the least amount of undulations compared to the other trail segments.
- 5. Adding grass pavers at the base of the bluff trail to connect the upper picnic area. Some erosion has occurred due to steep slopes. To mitigate this issue grass pavers can be installed under native grass.
- 6. Maintaining and improving trail signage with reassurance and junction markers. Replace damaged or broken signs and add new signs where needed.

The chosen contractor Ultimate Excavating of Fort Atkinson, WI, specializing in sustainable trail design, will complete trail reconstruction and maintenance work. This is the first phase of work in the total project that is partially funded by grant dollars. The first phase of work will be completed during the 2013 construction season. Park volunteers will be rallied to assist parks staff and/or the contractor with rehabilitation of closed trails. Parks staff will complete trail sign replacement and installation.

The project is funded in part by a Recreation Trails Stewardship Grant Funds Program of the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources. This proposed project will make the trail more user-friendly and sustainable.

Matching local funds for the trail improvement project are included in the 2013 Parks budget.

Dear Rock County Public Works Committee Member:

Last year, the National Park Service, Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, and Ice Age Trail Alliance initiated the Corridor Planning Process for the Ice Age National Scenic Trail (NST) in Rock County. The purpose of the Corridor Planning Process is to identify a general location for the trail and actively involve the public in this decision making process. Last winter, we held three open house scoping meetings to obtain public input regarding this project. Today, we would like to provide you with an update of where we are in the Ice Age NST's Corridor Planning Process and brief you on our next steps.

Last year at the three open houses, we presented 12 broad study areas for the Ice Age NST to landowners, public officials, and the public for their input. These wide study areas were defined by utilizing the criteria for locating the trail—significant geologic, biologic, cultural features, as well as existing trail, availability of public lands, and opportunities for aesthetic, educational, and recreational experiences. Approximately 50 people attended the meetings and we received many comments. With the conclusion of these scoping meetings, the Corridor Planning Process has now entered its second phase—Development of Alternatives.

Over the summer and fall of 2012, the planning team developed three alternative corridors for the trail incorporating the public comments we heard. The boundaries of the alternatives are outlined using roads, section lines, and in one instance, the Rock River. All three alternative corridors include the existing Ice Age NST through Milton and Janesville, and connect to Magnolia Bluff County Park and Clover Valley State Wildlife Area. They contain glacial features such as moraines, a tunnel channel, kettle ponds, and outwash plains; and diverse biological communities such as wetlands, lakes, woodlands and restored prairies. To provide additional interest and potential facilities for trail users, communities and cultural resource destinations such as Indian Ford, Fulton, Evansville, and Footville are included also.

This spring a second series of open house meetings will be held to present these three alternative corridors and a fourth, no-action alternative for public review and input. Enclosed are maps of the proposed alternatives. In late March, landowners within the alternative corridors will receive an invitation to attend public open house meetings that will be held in late April. The schedule for the meetings is as follows:

Based on public comments obtained at these meetings and criteria to locate the trail, the planning team will then identify a preferred alternative corridor and possible route options for the Ice Age NST through Rock County. This final "Corridor of Opportunity" will be approximately 3-5 miles in width. The reason it is so wide is to allow flexibility to get the trail through since all participation by landowners is voluntary. The trail's tread is approximately 3.5 feet wide. The width of the trailway (area around the trail) purchased for the Ice Age NST will depend on what the landowner desires. To conclude the Corridor Planning Process, a third and final series of open house meetings will be held, (tentatively spring 2014), to present the results of this planning effort. A Draft Corridor Plan and Environmental Assessment also will be available for comment.

The partners involved in the Ice Age NST recognize that its completion will take a very long time. It will not be finished in the next year or in the next several years, but will happen slowly as landowners voluntarily give permission (handshake agreement) for the trail to cross their property, or allow the purchase of lands or easements for the trail.
