



 - Same State/Federal Legislative Districts


Municipalities Over 35,000

 - Additional Poll Workers, Paperwork, Ballot Styles


Normal Timeline for Redistricting



Re:	Criteria for Establishing County Board Supervisor District Boundaries

One of the first steps for establishing new supervisor districts in 2021 is for the Ad Hoc Committee to come to an agreement on criteria or rules for drawing new districts using 2020 census data. Some criteria are written into State Statutes and some are personal or group preference. Below is a list of possible criteria to use as a guide for redistricting. You are allowed to add to or subtract criteria or rules from the list.

In order to help us all make good use of our time at the committee meeting, please consider and rank these criteria with 1 being your highest or most important criteria, and 11 being your least important. Please return this memo with your ranking by end of the day August 10, 2021 to Lisa Tollefson via in person, fax (608-757-5662) or email Lisa.Tollefson@co.rock.wi.us.

At the meeting, the goal is to come to a consensus on the criteria so that staff has guidelines for creating a number of possible supervisory district plans for your consideration at a future meeting.

- Compactness of districts
- Districts of substantially equal population (plus/minus 3%) (plus/minus 5%) (Other)
- Known population trends to allow future population growth in district
- Follow municipal boundaries where possible
- Follow school district boundaries where possible
- Community of interest (e.g. a lake association, an unincorporated village, etc.)
- Minority representation
- Preserve polling locations within districts
- Preserve single incumbent for each district
- Preserve existing wards where possible
- Follow physical features (e.g. rivers, roads, etc.)
- Other _____
