10.A. Wisconsin State Treasurer - Dawn Marie Sass.

Ms. Dawn Marie Sass felt the people of Wisconsin deserves to know what the state is doing with their money, so for the past two years consecutively, she has visited all 72 counties sharing about the state treasury. There are essentially three departments of the state treasury. First there is the Wisconsin College Savings Program also know as EdVest. This provides for students to go to college tax-free and includes 12 different investment options from conservative to aggressive, now including a CD option. This department has set some funds aside for an essay contest, a video contest and a coloring contest to give away scholarship. Ms. Sass announced that Beloit students have done very well in this contest with a winner in both the essay and video contest.

The second department is the Unclaimed Property Division. There is currently \$330 million in funds and \$46 million in stock assets in this department. This unclaimed money belongs to the taxpayers and business owners of Wisconsin and last year, over \$28 million dollars were reclaimed in this department. Rock County has \$4,135,457.53 owed to 28,790 people and Rock County Treasurer Vicki Brown has that list in her office. It is also on CD as printed totals over 900 pages and isn't eco-friendly to print out.

Lastly, the Local Government Investment Pool with a current bank of nearly \$4 billion dollars. This fund is completely liquid and has undergone a few changes recently. The FSA previously insured commercial paper and no longer does so. Credit Insurance only covers specific asset types and no longer covers commercial paper, which is .7% of our total investment. Even without the insurance, the department will continue to invest in commercial paper, but only in the highest rated companies. There has never been a loss in the LGIP due to a credit default, which makes this pool a safe investment for local governments, which is the primary objective of the department. CD portfolios are covered by FDIC but not the entire balance. An S&P rating is in process for the LGIP.

10.B. <u>Sheriff's Office – Report on Snow Emergencies</u>.

Sheriff Bob Spoden, Commander Troy Knudson and State Patrol's Sgt. Tom Wolfe presented on Snow Emergency response and preparedness. The interstate incident of February 8, 2008 where 21" of snow, 19 miles of backup and thousands of people stranded became an opportunity to review the situation and prepare a response plan should the event occur at several levels of severity.

One area found to be inadequate by Donald Dunbar in the February 8th incident was the level of communications among agencies, causing a delay in understanding the seriousness of the matter. Hence, the Winter Emergency Plan was developed. It is a matrix for response that includes multiple levels of response.

A level III is for 6" of snow and is status quo, business as usual and NIMS is on alert.

A level II is for 6-12" of snow where traffic delays are likely. Staffing moves to a +2 over minimum, pre-deployment of signage, snowmobiles and 4x4 vehicles are deployed, pre-event planning is done by phone, limited EOC contact and the highway camera system is used to monitor situation.

A level I is when 12-hour shifts are likely, hi-level press releases are utilized asking people to stay off the roads, pre-deployment of signage, EOC contact increases, there is a potential for an emergency declaration and other resource groups such as the National Guard, ATV clubs, the Fire Department, etc. are utilized at various levels.

Inter-agency meetings continue with the County, Regional, State Patrol, DNR, WisDOT, and the Red Cross to make sure that adequate measures are taken to assure safety during treacherous times. Ben Coopman of the Highway Department has also made some significant contributions to response efforts. Shirley Connors with Emergency Management has employed resources for the departments to utilize in response modes. The Janesville Police Department, I.T., Red Cross and Civilian volunteers have also been involved in measures of activation at the various levels of response. Other statewide resources improved since last year to link public safety information include the pre-deployed signage you may notice at the on and off ramps of the interstate, improvements to the alternate routes on secondary roads, and the new WI 511 traveler information system. Travelers can call 511 on their cell phones and receive an update on road conditions in multiple regions across the state.
