#### ADMINISTRATIVE NOTE:

Recommended.

The U W Extension and Land Conservation Departments have been awarded a \$10,500 grant through the Multi-Agency Land and Water Education Grant Program. The grants program is designed to provide financial assistance in the integration of educational programming and local conservation efforts.

Rock County has a majority of its livestock operation located in areas classified as environmentally sensitive for nutrient management planning purposes due to open water, rolling topography, shallow soils and shallow depth to groundwater. There is a need to educate and train Agricultural producers on writing and implementing nutrient management plans. Nutrient management on livestock operations includes the proper crediting of manure applications, and nutrient credits from plant sources in order to avoid excess application of nitrogen and phosphorus.

The grant project will be utilized to assist dairy and livestock producers in writing and implementing nutrient management plans for their operations. Seasonal labor will be hired to conduct the farm practice inventory and collect the necessary information to write the farm nutrient management plans. The position responsibilities include manure sampling, manure spread calibration, animal inventories, critical site identification and organizing field characteristic information. Conservation plans for the farm operations will be updated as well. The seasonal labor will terminate at the completion of the project in late 2010 Funding for the seasonal position is fully supported by the grant.

Nutrient management planning is a priority issue in Rock County.

The Council on Aging budget is funded primarily with federal Older Americans Act and state revenues. During the budget preparation process, the amount of funding is estimated. Actual amounts are not available until after the federal budget is passed and the State Bureau of Aging and Disability Resources determines final allocations for counties.

This budget amendment decreases the amount of funding through Title III-B (Supportive Services), Title III-C-1 (Congregate Meal Program), Title III-D (Preventive Health) and Title III-E (Family Caregiver Support Program) of the Older Americans Act. It also decreases the amount of state aid received through the State Senior Community Services Program. A small increase was received for Title III-C-2 (Home Delivered Meal Program).

No county funds are required.

The Arrowhead Digitization of Rock county History Resources will provide electronic access to materials that are today only available in print format and to people who can go to the Milton Historical society, Edgerton Public library and the Eager Free Public library. Each of these locations provides unique collections of records for the Milton House, a hotel that also served in the Underground Railroad; the Edgerton Public Library with unique resources documenting the history of Edgerton; and a continuation of a digitization project started in 2009 with materials from the history room of the Eager Free Public Library in Evansville. Each of these communities has a rich history of agriculture, industry, commerce and education. The project is endorsed by the boards of the Eager Free Public Library, the Edgerton Public Library and the Milton Historical Society. The administrator of the grant administered the digitization project completed in 2009.

The Edgerton Public Library, the Milton Historical Society, and the Eager Free Public Library in Evansville have unique collections that document the histories of the three communities. This digitization project will barely touch the surface of materials created before 1923 that could be digitized to make the historical photographs, local histories, hotel registers, school annuals, city directories, and other historical documentation available on the Internet.

Children are provided with case management services by Departmental staff. The bulk of the funding pays for purchased services though community-based organizations. Waiver slots come in three types: Regular, Crisis, and Local Match. Each type of slot carries a different fixed monthly allotment to cover the cost of services provided.

This resolution amends the 2009 Human Services budget to accept Screening, Brief Intervention and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT) funding in the amount of \$12,000, which has been awarded to the Department by the state Department of Health Services (DHS).

The SBIRT program originally sought to compensate primary care physicians for referring clients with Alcohol and Other Drug Addiction (AODA) issues to community-based treatment. However, in the last 1 ½ years, the state has made some of these funds available for actual treatment. The Human Services Department is able to access these funds to refer a limited number of our clients to AODA treatment providers in the community.

There is no local matching requirement to accept these funds.

# AWARDING CONTRACT FOR SALT SHED ROOF REPLACEMENTS AT DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

This Resolution authorizes entering a contract for a project to replace the roof over the salt shed at the Main Shop of the Department of Public Works (DPW) in Janesville. The building was erected in 1982 and has had one additional roof installed over the existing roof so far. Due to unknown structural damage to the roof structure, \$100,000 was included in the 2010 budget for this purpose.

Recently, DPW staff became aware of similar conditions on a smaller salt shed it has at its sub-shop on Shopiere Road at Interstate Highway 39/90. That building was erected in approximately 1976 and has at least one, and possibly two other roofs installed on it.

Once DPW staff began the detailed design of the Main Shop salt shed roof project, it was determined that perhaps both roofs could be done within the approved budget amount. Bids were structured and received using this flexible award concept.

This Resolution also authorizes entering another contract for a project to replace the roof over the salt shed at the Shopiere Road site.

This resolution awards contracts to Center Construction of Evansville, Wisconsin for \$16,297 and \$5,640 for the Main Shop and Shopiere Road salt sheds, respectively, for a total of \$21,937. It is expected that an unknown effort of structural repair work will be added to these contracts. Since this work is anticipated to be minor in scope and needs timely authorization to proceed, the resolution also gives authority to the Director of Public Works to authorize said repairs up to fifteen percent (15%) of the contract amounts, individually or in aggregate.

This Resolution is approving Superl, Inc., an FM Certified fire stopping contractor, to properly fire stop and document all walls and floors at Rock Haven per State and Federal regulations. For resident safety, in the event of a fire all walls and floors need to be smoke tight while maintaining the proper fire rating, per Rock Haven's life safety plan.

Rock Haven has four separate smoke compartments per resident floor, which allows residents to be moved to a safe area on their floor in the event of a fire. This design reduces the need for a vertical evacuation during a fire, yet increases the need for each fire compartment to be smoke tight. Elevators cannot be used during a fire; therefore, if there were a need to evacuate the entire building residents would have to be taken down the stairs in an evacuation chair.

Funds from this Grant are being used to acquire properties located in Rock County outside of the Cities of Beloit & Janesville on which the structures were substantially damaged and were owner-occupied.

Requirements of the Federal Privacy Act prevent the announcement of the property addresses until the properties are purchased.

Per State and Federal requirements, depending on current ownership, Rock County had conducted either pre-or post-flood appraisals on subject properties to determine the pre- or post-flood value of the subject properties. The results of these appraisals were used to establish offers to purchase for the subject properties, and

Rock County has received an accepted offer to purchase for one of the subject properties, based on the post-flood appraised value of \$60,000. The purchase of the property is contingent on approval by the Rock County Board of Supervisors.

Per the Housing Procedures Manual for Rock County, the Planning & Development Committee and Planning & Development Agency have been working to implement the provisions of the Grant. Arranging for the purchase of the property has been done in accordance with State and Federal regulations and requirements.

The Planning & Development Committee and Agency will comply with Federal requirements for demolishing structures on the property, conduct site restoration activities, and conduct final grading and seeding. Upon completion of this work, final disposition of the property will be determined.

#### **Executive Summary**

## Recommended Ordinance Amendments Construction Site Erosion Control Ordinance (Chapter 27) and Storm Water Management Ordinance (Chapter 28)

The County of Rock was authorized by the DNR on November 13, 2006 to discharge stormwater from the County owned Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4) in the Urbanized Area under a general Wisconsin Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (WPDES) MS4 permit. The Urbanized Area is determined by population density based on the 2000 census. As per the permit language, MS4 means a conveyance or system of conveyances including roads with drainage systems, municipal streets, catch basins, curbs, gutters, ditches, constructed channels or storm drains, which meets all of the following criteria: Owned or operated by a municipality, designed or used for collecting or conveying storm water, and which is not a combined sewer conveying both sanitary and storm water.

The County's WPDES MS4 General Permit outlines certain minimum programs and documentation that must be developed and submitted by dates certain. Among the requirements is to adopt and enforce construction site erosion control and post-construction storm water management regulations, which the County has had in place since March 2004. These ordinances have been approved by the DNR, subject to additions and corrections outlined in the two subject resolutions. The amendments are for the most part simple, non-substantive changes to make wording consistent with the state model ordinances. The following, however, describes a substantive change in administration of the Construction Site Erosion Control Ordinance (Chapter 27).

#### Regulation of erosion control at public building and places of employment

As per section 2.4.1.1.3 of the WPDES MS4 permit, the county must request from the Department of Commerce authority to regulate erosion control at public buildings and places of employment. These construction activities are currently regulated by Commerce and are exempt from the Rock County Erosion Control Ordinance, as specified in sec. 59.693(2) Wis. Stats. (authorizing statute). The ability for the Department of Commerce to grant this authority is found in sec. 101.1205(4) Wis. Stats. The Land Conservation Committee acted on this request at the May 2008 Committee meeting. Authority was granted in June 2008, subject to a number of provisions. One provision is that the County retains the services of a state certified soil erosion inspector. Staff member Andrew Baker completed the training course and exam in March 2009 and received certification in July 2009. The proposed amendments to the Erosion Control Ordinance are intended to accept and reflect the transfer of this authority to the County

No changes in the typical review or permitting process are required and permit fees are collected to defer the cost of administration. The authority to regulate erosion control at public buildings and places of employment will have the same jurisdiction as the existing ordinance (all unincorporated areas except the Town of Beloit). It is predicted that this new requirement will result in one or two additional erosion control permits per year. Furthermore, many of these potential newly regulated sites would currently require a permit under the existing Storm Water Management Ordinance, so the change in permit numbers and inspection frequency should be very minimal.

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Rock does ordain as follows:

I. Chapter 27 of the Rock County Ordinances shall be amended to read as follows (new language underscored, deleted language crossed out):

#### 6 SECTION 27.02 AUTHORITY

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44 45 (1) This ordinance is adopted under the authority granted by secs. 59.693, and 92.07(15) and 101.1205(4) Wis. Stats. This ordinance supersedes all conflicting and contradictory construction site erosion control regulations previously adopted by the County of Rock under sec. 59.69, Wis. Stats.

#### (B) EXEMPTIONS.

- 1. This ordinance does not apply to the following:
- e. Land disturbing activity that includes the construction of a building and is regulated by the Wisconsin Department of Commerce under sec. COMM 21-60 Wis. Adm. Code;

Note: the above section in the in the existing ordinance should read "...secs COMM 21 and COMM 60 Wis. Adm. Code." This was inadvertently combined to COMM 21.60 during the editing process of the last ordinance amendment and is an error. The intention of this amendment is to strike any exemption relating to sec. COMM 60 Wis. Adm. Code, which refers to public buildings and places of employment. COMM 21 remains and refers to UDC 1-2 family dwellings.

#### 28 SECTION 27.07 PERFORMANCE STANDARDS

The permit holder shall maintain all BMPs necessary once a week and within 24 hours of each rain of 0.5 inches or more to meet the requirements of this ordinance until the site has achieved final site stabilization and a written BMP removal authorization has been received from the LCD.

#### **Executive Summary**

## Recommended Ordinance Amendments Construction Site Erosion Control Ordinance (Chapter 27) and Storm Water Management Ordinance (Chapter 28)

The County of Rock was authorized by the DNR on November 13, 2006 to discharge stormwater from the County owned Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4) in the Urbanized Area under a general Wisconsin Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (WPDES) MS4 permit. The Urbanized Area is determined by population density based on the 2000 census. As per the permit language, MS4 means a conveyance or system of conveyances including roads with drainage systems, municipal streets, catch basins, curbs, gutters, ditches, constructed channels or storm drains, which meets all of the following criteria: Owned or operated by a municipality, designed or used for collecting or conveying storm water, and which is not a combined sewer conveying both sanitary and storm water.

The County's WPDES MS4 General Permit outlines certain minimum programs and documentation that must be developed and submitted by dates certain. Among the requirements is to adopt and enforce construction site erosion control and post-construction storm water management regulations, which the County has had in place since March 2004. These ordinances have been approved by the DNR, subject to additions and corrections outlined in the two subject resolutions. The amendments are for the most part simple, non-substantive changes to make wording consistent with the state model ordinances. The following, however, describes a substantive change in administration of the Construction Site Erosion Control Ordinance (Chapter 27).

#### Regulation of erosion control at public building and places of employment

As per section 2.4.1.1.3 of the WPDES MS4 permit, the county must request from the Department of Commerce authority to regulate erosion control at public buildings and places of employment. These construction activities are currently regulated by Commerce and are exempt from the Rock County Erosion Control Ordinance, as specified in sec. 59.693(2) Wis. Stats. (authorizing statute). The ability for the Department of Commerce to grant this authority is found in sec. 101.1205(4) Wis. Stats. The Land Conservation Committee acted on this request at the May 2008 Committee meeting. Authority was granted in June 2008, subject to a number of provisions. One provision is that the County retains the services of a state certified soil erosion inspector. Staff member Andrew Baker completed the training course and exam in March 2009 and received certification in July 2009. The proposed amendments to the Erosion Control Ordinance are intended to accept and reflect the transfer of this authority to the County

No changes in the typical review or permitting process are required and permit fees are collected to defer the cost of administration. The authority to regulate erosion control at public buildings and places of employment will have the same jurisdiction as the existing ordinance (all unincorporated areas except the Town of Beloit). It is predicted that this new requirement will result in one or two additional erosion control permits per year. Furthermore, many of these potential newly regulated sites would currently require a permit under the existing Storm Water Management Ordinance, so the change in permit numbers and inspection frequency should be very minimal.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

On January 28, 2010 the County Board adopted Resolution 10-1B-457 designating Rock County to be a Recovery Zone for purposes of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 [the "Recovery Act"].

The county received a \$10,034,000 Recovery Zone Economic Development Bonds allocation under the Recovery Act. This alternative debt financing option may be used by the county for its own purposes or reallocated to eligible municipalities within Rock County.

The county will be issuing debt on or about June 1, 2010 using Recovery Zone Economic Bonds in the amount of \$5,865,000. This leaves a balance of \$4,169,000 of the county's \$10,034,000 allocation to be reallocated to other eligible municipalities within Rock County.

The Beloit City Council adopted a resolution on February 1, 2010 requesting the county reallocate up to \$4,635,000 of Recovery Zone Economic Bond authority to the city for its debt purposes. No other eligible Rock County municipality has requested a reallocation of the county's bonding authority. This resolution reallocates the balance of the county's Recovery Zone Economic Bond authority to the City of Beloit.
