10.A. Rock County Coroner 2008 Activity Report.

Coroner Jenifer Keach presented the 2008 Activity Report for the coroner's office. The office investigated 679 deaths, issued 564 cremation permits and ordered 78 autopsies in 2008. Jenifer noted that the number of traffic fatalities had decreased to 18 from 36 on 2007, and 13 of the fatalities were alcohol related. Eleven were not wearing seatbelts. The coroner's office investigated 14 overdose deaths and saw an increase in heroin related deaths. There were 15 suicides in 2008, and this was the same number as in 2007. There were four homicides in Rock County in 2008; three female and one male victim. The Child Death Review Team reviewed 22 cases from 2005 to 2007. The local team made a recommendation to the state level team to promote education about safe sleeping practices for infants.

Jenifer reported that the coroner's office spent over \$10,000 on transport services by funeral homes in 2008, but noted that with the use of the new coroner van the office had spent less than \$1,000 for transport services in the first six months of 2009. She feels that the van has proven to be a useful and cost-effective purchase. Coroner Keach also announced her recent election as President of the Wisconsin Coroners and Medical Examiners Association in June.
