Wisconsin Elder Economic Security Initiative, Johanna Hatch, Coordinator Wisconsin Women's Network.

Supervisor Thomas introduced Johanna Hatch, of the Wisconsin Women's Network, a coalition of organizations and individuals that advances the status of women and girls in Wisconsin through communication, education, and advocacy. Ms. Hatch presented the Wisconsin Elder Economic Security Initiative, supported by the Retirement Research Foundation, the Atlantic Philanthropies and the Helen Bader Foundation.

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Ms. Hatch shared Wisconsin Aging Statistics such as 13.1% of Wisconsin's population is over 65; 7.4% live below the Federal poverty level; and, 29.6% live below 200% of the Federal poverty level. The Elder Economic Security Initiative is a multi-year project that offers a new measure of how much income older people need to meet their needs and tools to shape policies and programs to improve elders' economic well being.

The goals of the initiative are to change the public dialogue from "elder poverty" to "economic security", provide a framework decision guide for elders, and influence the development and evaluation of public policies and programs. Ms. Hatch shared with the Board of Supervisors things they can do to support the initiative and asked them to become a part of the national movement.

12.G <u>Creating Chapter XXIX of the Rock County Code of Ordinances – Rock County</u> Zoning Ordinance: Airport Overlay Zoning District (AOZD); Repealing Section 16.38 Resolution 09-4A-241

I. The County Board of Supervisors does ordain as follows:

Chapter XXIX of the Rock County Code of Ordinances – Rock County Zoning Ordinance: Airport Overlay Zoning District (AOZD), as attached hereto, is hereby created as Chapter 29 of the Rock County Code of Ordinances.

- II. Section 16.38 of the Rock County Code of Ordinances is hereby repealed.
- III. This ordinance shall take effect on January 1, 2010.

The Rock County Southern Wisconsin Airport Land Use Plan (SWRALUP) and Airport Overlay Zoning District (AOZD) Ordinance is intended to maintain compatible land uses in the immediate vicinity of the airport (3 miles). The documents are intended to enhance the preservation of the airspace and increase the safety and quality of life for the nearby residents and businesses. As the airport area continues to experience new development and increased intensity in land uses, it is imperative to ensure that these developments are consistent and compatible with the airspace so as to preserve the County's investment in the airport, while avoiding unsafe operations and safety hazards for airport users and nearby residents.
