REPEALING SECTION 3.206(19) AND CREATING SECTION 3.220 OF THE ROCK COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES

The Rock County Board of Supervisors at its regular meeting this <u>28</u> day of <u>February</u>, does ordain as follows:

 I. Section 3.206(19) of the Rock County Code of Ordinances is hereby repealed.

II. Section 3.220 of the Rock County Ordinances is created to read as follows:

3.220 Mistreatment of Animals

The following Wisconsin Statutes are hereby adopted by reference to the 2011-2012 statutes and as subsequently amended:

(A) Definitions: The definitions in Wis. Stats. 951.01 and as subsequently amended apply to this section.

(B) 951.02 Mistreating animals. No person may treat any animal, whether belonging to the person or another, in a cruel manner. This section does not prohibit normal and accepted veterinary practices.

(C) 951.05 Transportation of animals. No person may transport any animal in or upon any vehicle in a cruel manner.

(D) 951.13 Providing proper food and drink to confined animals. No person owning or responsible for confining or impounding any animal may fail to supply the animal with a sufficient supply of food and water as prescribed in this section.

(1) FOOD. The food shall be sufficient to maintain all animals in good health.

(2) WATER. If potable water is not accessible to the animals at all times, it shall be provided daily and in sufficient quantity for the health of the animal.

(E) 951.14 Providing proper shelter. No person owning or responsible for confining or impounding any animal may fail to provide the animal with proper shelter as prescribed in this section. In the case of farm animals, nothing in this section shall be construed as imposing shelter requirements or standards more stringent than normally accepted husbandry practices in the particular county where the animal or shelter is located.

(1) INDOOR STANDARDS. Minimum indoor standards of shelter shall include:

(a) Ambient temperatures. The ambient temperature shall be compatible with the health of the animal.

(b) Ventilation. Indoor housing facilities shall be adequately ventilated by natural or mechanical means to provide for the health of the animals at all times.

(2) OUTDOOR STANDARDS. Minimum outdoor standards of shelter shall include: 43 44 (a) Shelter from sunlight. When sunlight is likely to cause heat exhaustion of an 45 animal tied or caged outside, sufficient shade by natural or artificial means shall be 46 47 provided to protect the animal from direct sunlight. As used in this paragraph, "caged" does not include farm fencing used to confine farm animals. 48 49 (b) Shelter from inclement weather. 1. 'Animals generally.' Natural or artificial 50 51 shelter appropriate to the local climatic conditions for the species concerned shall be provided as necessary for the health of the animal. 52 53 2. 'Dogs." If a dog is tied or confined unattended outdoors under weather conditions which adversely affect the health of the dog, a shelter of suitable size to 54 accommodate the dog shall be provided. 55 56 (3) SPACE STANDARDS. Minimum space requirements for both indoor and outdoor 57 enclosures shall include: 58 59 60 (a) Structural strength. The housing facilities shall be structurally sound and maintained in good repair to protect the animals from injury and to contain the 61 animals. 62 63 (b) Space requirements. Enclosures shall be constructed and maintained so as to 64 65 provide sufficient space to allow each animal adequate freedom of movement. 66 Inadequate space may be indicated by evidence of debility, stress or abnormal behavior patterns. 67 68 69 (4) SANITATION STANDARDS. Minimum standards of sanitation for both indoor and outdoor enclosures shall include periodic cleaning to remove excreta and other waste 70 materials, dirt and trash so as to minimize health hazards. 71 72 73 (F) 951.15 Abandoning animals. No person may abandon any animal. 74 75 (G) Whoever violates this section shall be subject to a forfeiture not to exceed \$500 upon conviction. 76 77 78 III.
